- 1 § 8101. Definitions.
- 2 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 3 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 4 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 5 <u>"Automatic license plate reader system." A system of one or</u>
- 6 more mobile or fixed high-speed cameras combined with computer
- 7 <u>algorithms to convert images of registration plates into</u>
- 8 <u>computer-readable data.</u>
- 9 <u>"Captured data."</u> The global positioning system coordinates,
- 10 dates and times, photographs, license plate numbers and any
- 11 other data collected by or derived from an automatic license
- 12 <u>plate reader.</u>
- 13 "Government entity." An office, agency, board, bureau,
- 14 <u>department</u>, commission or authority funded or established by a
- 15 State, county or local government to carry out a government
- 16 function.
- 17 "Secured area." An area, enclosed by clear boundaries, to
- 18 which access is limited and not open to the public and entry is
- 19 <u>only obtainable through specific access-control points.</u>
- 20 § 8102. Restrictions on use.
- 21 (a) General rule. -- Except as otherwise provided in
- 22 subsection (b), it is unlawful for an individual, partnership,
- 23 corporation, association or other entity to use an automatic
- 24 license plate reader system.
- 25 (b) Exceptions. -- An automatic license plate reader may be
- 26 used by any of the following:
- 27 <u>(1) Any State, county or municipal law enforcement</u>
- agency for the purpose of protecting public safety,
- 29 conducting criminal investigations or ensuring compliance
- 30 with Federal, State and local laws.

- 1 (2) A government entity for the purpose of enforcing
- 2 <u>State and local parking laws.</u>
- 3 (3) A government entity for the purpose of monitoring
- 4 <u>and collecting an electronic toll.</u>
- 5 (4) A government entity for the purpose of controlling
- 6 <u>access to a secured area.</u>
- 7 § 8103. Preservation and disclosure of captured data.
- 8 (a) Confidentiality of data. -- Captured data collected or
- 9 <u>retained through the use of an automatic license plate reader</u>
- 10 system in accordance with section 8102(b) (relating to
- 11 restrictions on use) is confidential and is only available for
- 12 <u>use by a law enforcement agency in carrying out its functions,</u>
- 13 by a government entity collecting information for its intended
- 14 purpose and for any related civil or criminal proceeding.
- 15 (b) Disclosure prohibited. -- Except as provided in subsection
- 16 (c), a law enforcement agency or government entity authorized to
- 17 use an automatic license plate reader system shall not sell,
- 18 trade or exchange captured plate data for any purpose.
- 19 (c) Sharing of data. -- Captured plate data that indicates
- 20 evidence of an offense or provides information to protect the
- 21 public may be shared with law enforcement agencies and with
- 22 criminal justice agencies in the performance of their official
- 23 duties.
- 24 (d) Applicability of Right-to-Know-Law. -- Captured data
- 25 collected or retained through the use of an automatic license
- 26 plate reader system is not subject to disclosure under the act
- 27 of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know
- 28 Law.
- 29 § 8104. Penalties.
- 30 A violation of this chapter constitutes a misdemeanor of the

- 1 <u>second degree.</u>
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
