1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in trade and commerce, further providing for the offense of buying or exchanging Federal food order coupons, stamps, authorization cards or access devices and providing for the offense of unauthorized possession of electronic benefits transfer cards.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 7313 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
10	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
11	§ 7313. Buying or exchanging [Federal food order coupons,
12	stamps, authorization cards or access devices]
13	electronic benefits transfer cards.
14	(a) Offense definedA person commits the offense of buying
15	or exchanging [Federal food order coupons, stamps, authorization
16	cards or access devices] <u>electronic benefits transfer cards</u> if
17	he, not being authorized to do so by the United States
18	Department of Agriculture, buys or exchanges [Federal food order
19	coupons, stamps, authorization cards or access devices]

electronic benefits transfer cards for currency, or if he 1 2 accepts or causes to be accepted [Federal food order coupons, 3 stamps, authorization cards or access devices] electronic benefits transfer cards in exchange for any merchandise or 4 article except food, as defined by the United States Department 5 of Agriculture, or [Federal food order coupons, stamps, 6 7 authorization cards or access devices] electronic benefits 8 transfer cards in exchange for merchandise or articles, not 9 defined by the United States Department of Agriculture to be 10 surplus foods.

11 (b) Grading.--A person who violates this section commits a felony of the third degree if the amount involved is \$1,000 or 12 13 more. If the amount involved is less than \$1,000, the person commits a misdemeanor of the first degree. Amounts involved in 14 15 buying or exchanging [Federal food order coupons, stamps, 16 authorization cards or access devices] electronic benefits transfer cards committed pursuant to one scheme or course of 17 18 conduct, whether from the same person or several persons, shall 19 be aggregated in determining the grade of the offense.

20 (c) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following 21 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this 22 subsection:

23 ["Access device." The Pennsylvania ACCESS card or electronic24 benefit transfer card.

25 "Authorization card." The paper authorization to participate 26 that a person signs and then exchanges for the designated amount 27 of food coupons at a bank.]

<u>"Electronic benefits transfer card." The card issued to an</u>
<u>individual in order to grant access to public assistance cash or</u>
<u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits through an</u>

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1 <u>electronic delivery system.</u>

2	Section 2. Title 18 is amended by adding a section to read:
3	<u>§ 7313.1. Unauthorized possession of electronic benefits</u>
4	transfer cards.
5	(a) Offense definedA person commits the offense of
6	unauthorized possession of electronic benefits transfer cards if
7	he, not being authorized to do so by the United States
8	Department of Agriculture, has in his possession three or more
9	electronic benefits transfer cards issued to other persons or
10	the numbers of three or more electronic benefits transfer cards
11	issued to other persons.
12	(b) Grading
13	(1) A person who violates this section commits a felony
14	of the third degree if in possession of between 3 and 24
15	electronic benefits transfer cards, inclusive, regardless of
16	to whom the electronic benefits transfer cards have been
17	issued.
18	(2) If in possession of 25 or more electronic benefits
19	transfer cards, regardless of to whom the electronic benefits
20	transfer cards have been issued, the person commits a felony
21	of the second degree.
22	(c) Reporting requiredThe Office of Inspector General
23	shall report any violation of this section by a Supplemental
24	Nutrition Assistance Program licensed retailer to the United
25	States Department of Agriculture, Office of Inspector General.
26	(d) DefinitionAs used in this section, the term
27	"electronic benefits transfer card" means a card issued to an
28	individual in order to grant access to public assistance cash or
29	Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits through an
30	<u>electronic delivery system.</u>

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1 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
