AN ACT

Providing for competitive employment in an integrated setting in 1 State, county and local agencies for individuals with 2 disabilities; establishing the Employment First Program, the 3 Employment First State Coordinating Council and the Employment First Commission and providing for their powers 5 and duties; and conferring powers and imposing duties on the Governor and the Office of the Governor. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Short title. 10 11 This act shall be known as and may be cited as the 12 Pennsylvania Employment First Act. 13 Section 2. Declaration of policy. 14 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows: 15 It is the purpose of this act to ensure that 16 individuals with disabilities be given the opportunity to 17 achieve economic independence through jobs that pay regular 18 wages in typical community settings.

- 1 (3) All individuals are presumed competent and able and should be afforded the opportunity to work.
 - (4) Significant changes have occurred and are continuing to evolve with advances in effective support strategies and technology.
 - (5) Each year throughout this Commonwealth, thousands of high school students with disabilities who use 504 plans or qualify under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat. 327) graduate from special education programs and are ready and able to work at competitive wages in private and public sector jobs.
 - (6) The Commonwealth can realize a return on its significant investment in young adults with disabilities who have benefited from a free and appropriate public education and other State services by adopting policies that further the goal of competitive employment in an integrated setting for individuals with disabilities.
 - (7) Hundreds of thousands of job openings are listed every day, reflecting the challenges faced by employers in finding and keeping a dedicated work force, challenges that could be resolved, in part, through the hiring of individuals with disabilities.
 - (8) Recognition and furtherance of the benefits of meaningful work applies to all working individuals, including the opportunity for competitive employment in an integrated setting for individuals with disabilities.
- 27 Section 3. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 29 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 30 context clearly indicates otherwise:

- "Competitive employment." Work in the labor market:
- 2 (1) that is performed on a full-time or part-time basis
- 3 in an integrated setting; and
- 4 (2) for which an individual is compensated at or above
- 5 the minimum wage and not less than the customary wage and
- 6 level of benefits paid by the employer for the same or
- 7 similar work performed by individuals who do not have
- 8 disabilities.
- 9 "Commission." The Employment First Oversight Commission
- 10 established under section 6.
- "Council." The Employment First State Coordinating Council
- 12 established under section 5.
- "Disability." Either of the following:
- 14 (1) A documented physical or mental impairment that
- substantially limits one or more major life activities of an
- 16 individual.
- 17 (2) A documented impairment as defined by the Americans
- with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat.
- 19 327), including veterans' service-connected disabilities.
- "Integrated setting." With respect to employment, a setting
- 21 in which individuals with disabilities work with individuals
- 22 without disabilities, other than those individuals who are
- 23 providing services to the individuals with disabilities, to the
- 24 same extent that individuals without disabilities in comparable
- 25 positions interact with other individuals.
- 26 "Program." The Employment First Program established under
- 27 section 4.
- 28 Section 4. Employment First Program.
- 29 (a) Establishment. -- The Employment First Program is
- 30 established. The program shall require practicable:

- 1 (1) competitive employment in an integrated setting for
- 2 all working age adults and youths with disabilities,
- 3 regardless of the severity of the disability and the
- 4 assistance required; and
- 5 (2) employment services and opportunities to be offered
- for all individuals receiving publicly funded services,
- 7 regardless of whether they live in their own home or in a
- 8 residential setting and without regard to the type of service
- 9 funding.
- 10 (b) Implementation. -- State, county and local agencies that
- 11 provide services and support to individuals with disabilities of
- 12 working age shall comply with the requirements of the program
- 13 and ensure that the requirements of the program are effectively
- 14 implemented in agency programs and services to the extent
- 15 practicable.
- 16 (c) Collaboration. -- State, county and local agencies that
- 17 provide services and support to individuals with disabilities
- 18 shall coordinate efforts and collaborate within and among such
- 19 agencies to ensure that State programs, policies, procedures and
- 20 funding support competitive employment in an integrated setting
- 21 for individuals with disabilities of working age.
- 22 (d) Policies. -- State, county and local agencies shall review
- 23 their respective policies relating to payment of service
- 24 providers to align payment policies with the requirements of the
- 25 program. State, county and local agencies shall ensure that
- 26 providers of service coordination, case management and
- 27 authorization services funded through the State Medicaid
- 28 program, including home and community-based waiver programs,
- 29 receive financial incentives that support the placement and
- 30 continued employment of individuals with disabilities in

- 1 competitive employment in an integrated setting.
- 2 (e) Staff.--State, county and local agencies shall implement
- 3 the requirements of the program with trained and certified staff
- 4 that meet the competencies of national standards, including
- 5 certification as a Certified Employment Support Professional or
- 6 membership in the Association of Community Rehabilitation
- 7 Educators.
- 8 (f) Assessment.--State, county and local agencies shall
- 9 develop clear outcome expectations for employment that include
- 10 annual baseline employment data and specific percentage goals
- 11 for individuals gaining competitive employment in integrated
- 12 settings. On an annual basis, each agency shall complete an
- 13 assessment of its progress toward meeting these goals and ensure
- 14 that the information is publicly available and posted on its
- 15 publicly accessible Internet website.
- 16 (q) Progress. -- State agencies are authorized to share
- 17 general, nonindividualized data and information across systems
- 18 in an effort to track progress toward full implementation of the
- 19 the requirements of the program. State agencies are encouraged
- 20 to adopt measurable goals and objectives to promote the
- 21 assessment of progress under this subsection.
- 22 (h) State agency compliance. -- The following shall apply:
- 23 (1) State agencies shall make an effort to employ
- individuals with disabilities in no less than 7% of the
- overall State work force.
- 26 (2) No State agency shall be required to give preference
- in hiring to individuals with disabilities.
- 28 (3) The State Civil Service Commission shall review and
- 29 consider changes in its policies and procedures in order to
- 30 support progress towards the initial goal established under

- 1 this subsection.
- 2 (i) Initial plan. -- No later than one year after the
- 3 effective date of this subsection, the Office of the Governor
- 4 shall develop an initial three-year plan for the program for
- 5 submission to the General Assembly. The plan shall identify the
- 6 specific policies and implementation dates for State agency
- 7 compliance with this act.
- 8 (j) Annual report. -- The assessment information compiled by
- 9 each State, county and local agency under subsections (f) and
- 10 (g) and any other information deemed necessary shall be sent to
- 11 the Governor's Office of Policy and Planning no later than
- 12 August 1 of each year for consideration and inclusion in an
- 13 annual report by the Office of the Governor to the General
- 14 Assembly that documents continued and improved State, county and
- 15 local agency compliance with this act. The report shall be
- 16 submitted to the General Assembly no later than November 30 of
- 17 each year.
- 18 Section 5. Employment First State Coordinating Council.
- 19 (a) Establishment--The Governor shall establish the
- 20 Employment First State Coordinating Council, which shall be
- 21 chaired by a senior official in the Governor's Office of Policy
- 22 and Planning. The Governor shall appoint the members of the
- 23 council, which shall consist of the officials provided under
- 24 subsection (b).
- 25 (b) Composition. -- The council shall consist of the following
- 26 officials, who may not delegate their duties to other officials,
- 27 except for good cause:
- 28 (1) A Deputy Secretary in the Governor's Office of
- 29 Policy and Planning.
- 30 (2) The Executive Deputy Secretary of the Department of

- 1 Education.
- 2 (3) The Deputy Secretary for Elementary and Secondary
- 3 Education in the Department of Education.
- 4 (4) The Director of the Bureau of Special Education in 5 the Department of Education.
- 6 (5) The Executive Deputy Secretary of the Department of Human Services.
- 8 (6) The Deputy Secretary of the Office of Developmental 9 Programs in the Department of Human Services.
- 10 (7) The Deputy Secretary of the Office of Mental Health
 11 and Substance Abuse Services in the Department of Human
 12 Services.
- 13 (8) The Deputy Secretary of the Office of Long-Term
 14 Living in the Department of Human Services.
- 15 (9) The Executive Deputy Secretary of the Department of 16 Labor and Industry.
- 17 (10) The Deputy Secretary for Workforce Development of 18 the Department of Labor and Industry.
- 19 (11) The Executive Director of the Office of Vocational 20 Rehabilitation of the Department of Labor and Industry.
- 21 (c) Powers and duties.--The council shall have the following 22 powers and duties:
- 23 (1) Conduct:
- 24 (i) a detailed review of existing regulations,
 25 policies and procedures relating to the goal of
 26 competitive employment in an integrated setting for high
 27 school graduates with disabilities; and
- (ii) a review and alignment of service definitions,
 policies and payment structures within and across State
 agencies.

- 1 (2) Develop:
- 2 (i) recommendations to the Governor, the Secretary
- of Education, the Secretary of Human Services and the
- 4 Secretary of Labor and Industry for changes in
- 5 regulations, policies and procedures necessary to ensure
- 6 the robust implementation of the program; and
- 7 (ii) recommendations to the Governor for any
- 8 legislative changes necessary to support and implement
- 9 this act.
- 10 (d) Collaboration. -- The council shall ensure that agreements
- 11 among local entities of the State agencies are developed and
- 12 adopted to ensure appropriate collaboration among agencies at
- 13 regional and local levels across this Commonwealth.
- 14 (e) Meetings. -- The council shall meet quarterly and shall be
- 15 responsible for coordinating the development of policies
- 16 designed to implement this act by all State agencies providing
- 17 services to individuals with disabilities.
- 18 Section 6. Employment First Oversight Commission.
- 19 (a) Establishment and composition. -- An independent
- 20 Employment First Oversight Commission is established. The
- 21 commission shall consist of the following members, who shall
- 22 serve for a three-year term:
- 23 (1) Four members, not under the employ of the
- 24 Commonwealth, who are individuals with a disability or
- individuals who are knowledgeable about the employment of
- individuals with a disability. The following shall apply:
- 27 (i) One shall be appointed by the President pro
- tempore of the Senate.
- 29 (ii) One shall be appointed by the Minority Leader
- of the Senate.

- 1 (iii) One shall be appointed by the Speaker of the 2 House of Representatives.
- 3 (iv) One shall be appointed by the Minority Leader 4 of the House of Representatives.
- 5 (2) Two individuals with disabilities, appointed by the 6 Governor.
- 7 (3) Two parents or family members of individuals with disabilities, appointed by the Governor.
- 9 (4) Two individuals who have successful experience in 10 providing services and support to high school students and 11 recent graduates with disabilities leading to competitive 12 employment in an integrated setting, appointed by the 13 Governor.
- 14 (5) A representative of Disabilities Rights
 15 Pennsylvania, appointed by the Governor.
- 16 (6) A representative of the Pennsylvania Rehabilitation 17 Council, appointed by the Governor.
- 18 (7) A representative of the Pennsylvania Statewide 19 Independent Living Council, appointed by the Governor.
- 20 (b) Meetings.--The Governor shall designate one member to
- 21 convene and organize the first meeting of the commission at
- 22 which the commission shall elect a chairperson and such other
- 23 officers as it deems necessary from among its members. The
- 24 commission shall meet at least four times each year or at the
- 25 call of the chairperson. A quorum shall consist of a majority of
- 26 the members of the commission. All actions of the commission
- 27 shall be taken only after approval by a majority vote of the
- 28 members present after a quorum is established during a lawful
- 29 meeting of the commission.
- 30 (c) Reimbursement.--Each member of the commission shall be

- 1 reimbursed normal and customary travel expenses in accordance
- 2 with Commonwealth travel policies for attendance at meetings of
- 3 the commission.
- 4 (d) Progress. -- The commission shall establish measurable
- 5 goals and objectives governing the implementation of this act.
- 6 The commission shall track the measurable progress of public
- 7 agencies in implementing this act. All State agencies shall
- 8 fully cooperate with and provide data and information to assist
- 9 the commission in carrying out its duties.
- 10 (e) Annual report. -- The commission shall issue an annual
- 11 report on October 1 of each year, detailing the progress made on
- 12 each of the measurable goals and objectives during the preceding
- 13 fiscal year. The annual report shall also include
- 14 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly for
- 15 effective strategies and policies needed to support the
- 16 implementation of this act.
- 17 (f) Support. -- The Office of the Governor shall ensure that
- 18 reasonable staff and support are made available to the
- 19 commission to carry out its duties under this section. The
- 20 Office of the Governor shall also ensure that administrative
- 21 costs, including money for travel expenses authorized under
- 22 subsection (c) and money for the distribution of the annual
- 23 report and other related administrative costs, are made
- 24 available to enable the commission to carry out its duties under
- 25 this section. The commission may seek the attendance and
- 26 participation of members of the council in meetings of the
- 27 commission in order to assist the commission in carrying out its
- 28 responsibilities under this section.
- 29 Section 7. Training and outreach.
- 30 All State agencies providing services to individuals with

- 1 disabilities of working age shall establish systems of outreach
- 2 and training that provide information to the following
- 3 individuals about the program and available opportunities for
- 4 participation in competitive employment in an integrated
- 5 setting:
- 6 (1) Individuals with disabilities and their families.
- 7 (2) Providers of employment services for individuals
- 8 with disabilities.
- 9 (3) Education, vocational rehabilitation and human
- 10 service officials responsible for services to individuals
- 11 with disabilities.
- 12 Section 8. Effective date.
- 13 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
