A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing April 14, 2015, as the observance of Vaisakhi in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Vaisakhi is a holiday observed by Sikhs throughout
- 4 the world, celebrating the spring harvest and commemorating the
- 5 1699 gathering at Anandpur Sahib in Punjab, India, when the
- 6 founding of the Sikh family of soldier saints known as Khalsa
- 7 Panth occurred; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Sikh faith, which was established in the Punjab
- 9 region of India in the 1400s, persevered and expanded, with Guru
- 10 Gobind Singh founding the Khalsa Panth, a new order of Sikhism,
- 11 in 1699; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The Sikh people have a renowned military history
- 13 marked by gallantry and self-sacrifice that is epitomized by the
- 14 heroic last stand at the Battle of Saragarhi in 1897; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Today the Sikh people, who now number in the tens of
- 16 millions worldwide, including approximately 500 thousand in the
- 17 United States; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Sikh people mark Vaisakhi with parades, dancing,
- 2 singing and other festivities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Sikh community of Pennsylvania, part of the rich
- 4 cultural fabric of this Commonwealth, makes many valuable
- 5 contributions as its members work in a variety of professions
- 6 and businesses and contribute to our local communities;
- 7 therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize April 14, 2015, as the
- 9 observance of Vaisakhi in Pennsylvania.
