A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of May 2015 as "Melanoma and Skin Cancer Detection and Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The skin is the largest and most visible organ of
- 4 the body and performs many essential tasks, such as regulating
- 5 body temperature, protecting internal organs, providing
- 6 sensation and supporting metabolic functions; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Current estimates indicate that one in five
- 8 Americans will develop skin cancer in his or her lifetime; and
- 9 WHEREAS, More than 2 million cases of nonmelanoma skin cancer
- 10 are diagnosed in the United States each year; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Recent estimates show that 123,590 new cases of
- 12 melanoma, the deadliest form of skin cancer, will be diagnosed
- 13 in the United States each year; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Melanoma is the most common form of cancer for young
- 15 adults 25 to 29 years of age and the second most common form of
- 16 cancer for adolescents and young adults 15 to 29 years of age;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, The estimated total direct cost associated with the

- 1 treatment of melanoma in 2010 was \$2.36 billion; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Melanoma and other skin cancers are highly treatable
- 3 if detected early; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Sun exposure is the most preventable risk factor for
- 5 all skin cancers, including melanoma; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of May 2015 as
- 7 "Melanoma and Skin Cancer Detection and Prevention Month" in
- 8 Pennsylvania.
