A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing September 10, 2015, as "World Suicide Prevention  
2 Day" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, Suicidal behavior has become a major public health  
4 concern; and

5 WHEREAS, Cultures of silence and postsuicide stigmas still  
6 exist in many societies worldwide; and

7 WHEREAS, Around the globe, suicide ranks as a leading cause  
8 of death and remains a major preventable cause of premature  
9 death; and

10 WHEREAS, The number of suicide deaths per year exceeds the  
11 number of deaths from homicide and war combined; and

12 WHEREAS, More than 1 million people die from suicide each  
13 year, with 1 death from suicide occurring every 40 seconds; and

14 WHEREAS, In the United States, suicide is the 10th leading  
15 cause of death; and

16 WHEREAS, According to the recently released World Suicide  
17 Report, all 194 member states of the World Health Assembly are

1 seeking to reduce suicide rates by 10% through the year 2020;  
2 and

3 WHEREAS, "World Suicide Prevention Day," part of a worldwide  
4 suicide prevention initiative by the International Association  
5 for Suicide Prevention and the World Health Organization, is  
6 marking its 13th anniversary this year; and

7 WHEREAS, Key goals of this year's campaign are reaffirming  
8 the global commitment to suicide prevention, cultivating our  
9 connectedness and engendering open dialogue relating to suicide;  
10 and

11 WHEREAS, In keeping with these goals, Preventing Suicide:  
12 Reaching Out and Saving Lives is the theme of the 2015 "World  
13 Suicide Prevention Day" observance; therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize September 10, 2015, as  
15 "World Suicide Prevention Day" in Pennsylvania.
