INTRODUCED AND ADOPTED, SEPTEMBER 30, 2015

A RESOLUTION

1 Observing the week of October 4 through 10, 2015, as "Fire
2 Prevention Week 2015" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, The National Fire Protection Association announced
4 the theme of "Fire Prevention Week 2015" to be "Hear the Beep
5 Where You Sleep: Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm"; and

6 WHEREAS, "Fire Prevention Week" occurs annually during the
7 week in which October 9 falls, commemorating the Great Chicago
8 Fire of 1871; and

9 WHEREAS, In 1920, President Woodrow Wilson issued the first
10 "National Fire Prevention Day" proclamation; and

11 WHEREAS, According to the National Archives and Records
12 Administration's Library Information Center, "Fire Prevention
13 Week" is the longest running public health and safety observance
14 on record; and

15 WHEREAS, The National Fire Protection Association works in
16 coordination with partnering companies, organizations and fire
17 departments to promote "Fire Prevention Week" and its fire

1 safety messages throughout North America; and

2 WHEREAS, According to national statistics, having a working
3 smoke alarm in the home cuts the risk of dying in a home fire in
4 half; and

5 WHEREAS, Approximately three out of five home fire deaths
6 resulted from fires in properties without working smoke alarms;
7 and

8 WHEREAS, In one-quarter of the home fire deaths, smoke alarms
9 were present but did not sound; and

10 WHEREAS, More than 3,200 people died in fires during 2013,
11 with most of those deaths caused by home fires; and

12 WHEREAS, The vast majority of home fire deaths are
13 preventable, and having a working smoke alarm is essential in
14 helping to reduce those numbers; therefore be it

15 RESOLVED, That the Senate observe the week of October 4
16 through 10, 2015, as "Fire Prevention Week 2015" in
17 Pennsylvania.
