## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing February 29, 2016, as "Rare Disease Day" in 1 Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, According to the National Institutes of Health,
- there are approximately 7,000 diseases and conditions considered
- 5 rare, each affecting fewer than 200,000 Americans, in the United
- States; and 6
- 7 WHEREAS, While each of these diseases may affect small
- numbers of people, rare diseases as a group affect almost 30 8
- million Americans; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Many rare diseases are serious and debilitating
- 11 conditions that have a significant impact on the lives of those
- 12 affected; and
- 13 WHEREAS, While more than 450 drugs and biologics have been
- 14 approved for the treatment of rare diseases, according to the
- 15 Federal Food and Drug Administration, millions of Americans
- 16 still have rare diseases for which there is no approved
- 17 treatment; and
- WHEREAS, Individuals and families affected by rare diseases 18

- 1 often experience problems such as diagnosis delay, difficulty
- 2 finding a medical expert and lack of access to treatments or
- 3 ancillary services; and
- 4 WHEREAS, While some rare diseases, such as Amyotrophic
- 5 Lateral Sclerosis, commonly known as Lou Gehrig's disease, are
- 6 relatively well known, many others are not known at all by the
- 7 public, which leaves patients and their families to bear a large
- 8 share of the burden of funding research and raising public
- 9 awareness to support the search for treatments; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Thousands of Pennsylvanians are among those affected
- 11 by rare diseases since approximately one in ten Americans have
- 12 rare diseases; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The National Organization for Rare Disorders
- 14 organized a nationwide observance of "Rare Disease Day" on
- 15 February 29, 2016; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Thousands of patients, caregivers, medical
- 17 professionals, researchers, government officials, companies
- 18 developing treatments for rare diseases and others participated
- 19 in the observance; therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize February 29, 2016, as
- 21 "Rare Disease Day" in Pennsylvania.
