A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of September 26 through October 2, 2016, as "Diaper Need Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, "Diaper Need Awareness Week" will bring attention to
- 4 the insufficient supply of disposable diapers for children and
- 5 incontinent adults of this Commonwealth to remain clean, healthy
- 6 and dry; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The National Diaper Bank Network, a national
- 8 nonprofit organization dedicated to ensuring that every baby in
- 9 the United States can be clean, healthy and dry, reports that
- 10 nearly 5.3 million children in the United States three years of
- 11 age or younger suffer from diaper need; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Access to a reliable supply of clean diapers is a
- 13 necessity for the health and well-being of infants and toddlers,
- 14 their families, child-care providers and health care providers;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, Estimates show that disposable diapers cost as much
- 17 as \$100 per child per month and can consume nearly 20% of a
- 18 family's monthly income; and

- 1 WHEREAS, One in every three mothers finds it difficult to
- 2 provide diapers for her children; and
- 3 WHEREAS, A supply of diapers is usually a requirement for
- 4 infants and toddlers to attend and participate in child-care
- 5 programs; and
- 6 WHEREAS, According to a study by the UC Berkeley Labor
- 7 Center, infants and toddlers who participate in early education
- 8 programs are 2.5% more likely to go on to higher education; and
- 9 WHEREAS, When infants and toddlers cannot participate in
- 10 child-care programs, it makes it difficult for parents and
- 11 quardians to participate in the work force, which has a negative
- 12 impact on the economy; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Infants and toddlers who are living in households
- 14 with little or no access to diapers could spend a day or longer
- 15 in one diaper, leading to significant potential health risks
- 16 such as severe diaper rash and infections; and
- WHEREAS, According to a 2013 study by Yale University printed
- 18 in the Journal of Pediatrics, mothers without an adequate diaper
- 19 supply are more likely to experience depression and anxiety,
- 20 which can in turn have long-term effects on their children; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Most public resources, such as food stamps and the
- 22 Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program, do not cover the cost
- 23 of these needed items; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Those families living in poverty often do not have
- 25 access to personal washing machines, and most coin-operated
- 26 laundromats, for sanitary reasons, do not allow customers to
- 27 wash cloth diapers; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Diaper need is also a significant issue for senior
- 29 citizens and incontinent adults; and
- 30 WHEREAS, For seniors and incontinent adults, the lack of

- 1 clean disposable undergarments poses a serious health risk that
- 2 could lead to extended hospital stays and even death; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Incontinence products could cost as much as \$1,000 a
- 4 year, which often serves as a financial burden to seniors and
- 5 incontinent adults on fixed incomes; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Community organizations across this Commonwealth are
- 7 doing their part to help with this epidemic by hosting diaper
- 8 donation drives, which are critical in providing these essential
- 9 materials to working families and incontinent adults in need and
- 10 raising awareness about the real implications of a widening
- 11 diaper supply gap; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The National Diaper Bank Network is committed to
- 13 working with community groups and raising awareness of the
- 14 diaper gap in America by building the capacity of community-
- 15 based diaper banks to serve families throughout this
- 16 Commonwealth; and
- 17 WHEREAS, There are more than 275 diaper banks recognized by
- 18 the National Diaper Bank Network, distributing nearly 35 million
- 19 diapers annually; and
- 20 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has 11 diaper banks that are
- 21 recognized and active members of the National Diaper Bank
- 22 Network, distributing more than 1.3 million diapers per year to
- 23 communities across this Commonwealth; and
- 24 WHEREAS, These diaper banks require community support and
- 25 donations of diapers and dollars to allow them to continue to
- 26 serve our communities; therefore be it
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of September 26
- 28 through October 2, 2016, as "Diaper Need Awareness Week" in
- 29 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the efforts of the

- 1 National Diaper Bank Network and all community organizations
- 2 working to address the diaper gap in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 3 further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage the residents of this
- 5 Commonwealth to support community organizations and participate
- 6 in diaper drives to help improve, enhance and expand access to
- 7 diapers for our Commonwealth's children and incontinent adults.
