A RESOLUTION

Designating the month of October 2016 as "Lewy Body Dementia 1 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania. 2 3 WHEREAS, Lewy body dementia (LBD) is a chronic, progressive, 4 neurological disorder affecting thinking, movement, behavior and 5 sleep; and 6 WHEREAS, More than 1.4 million Americans are affected by LBD, 7 making it the second most common form of progressive dementia, second only to Alzheimer's disease in prevalence; and 8 9 WHEREAS, The most common symptoms of LBD include problems with memory and thinking, hallucinations, unpredictable changes 10 11 in concentration and attention, a sleep disorder causing people 12 to seemingly act out their dreams and Parkinson-like symptoms, 13 such as muscle rigidity or stiffness, a shuffling gait, tremors 14 or slowness of movement; and 15 WHEREAS, Ignorance of this disease is widespread even among 16 health care professionals, making LBD the most commonly 17 misdiagnosed form of dementia; and

18 WHEREAS, Early and accurate diagnosis of LBD is essential

because some medications prescribed regularly for Alzheimer's or
Parkinson's disease can have serious negative effects on people
with LBD; and

4 WHEREAS, There is currently no cure, therapy or drug to slow5 or halt the progression of LBD; therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of October 2016 7 as "Lewy Body Dementia Awareness Month"; and be it further 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the importance of 9 increasing public awareness of this disease and its early and 10 accurate diagnosis.
