AN ACT

Providing that employment shall not be conditional upon 1 membership or nonmembership in, nor upon the payment or 2 nonpayment of money to, a labor organization; and providing 3 for penalties and relief. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 The General Assembly finds and declares that to require a person to be a member of, or not to be a member of, a private 8 organization as a compulsory condition of work or employment is 10 not in accordance with fundamental principles of individual liberty and freedom of choice. It is therefore declared to be 11 12 the public policy of this Commonwealth that membership or 13 nonmembership in a labor union should not be made a condition of 14 the opportunity to work or to be or remain in the employment of any employer; that employees should have the right to form, 15 16 join, continue membership in or assist labor organizations and should equally have the right to refrain from forming, joining, 17

continuing membership in or assisting labor organizations; and

- 1 that any agreement, express or implied, between employers and
- 2 labor organizations, or any practice whatsoever, that directly
- 3 or indirectly makes membership or nonmembership in a labor
- 4 organization, or support or nonsupport of a labor organization,
- 5 a condition of employment or continued employment is a violation
- 6 of individual liberty and freedom and is against the public
- 7 policy of this Commonwealth.
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Freedom of
- 10 Employment Act.
- 11 Section 2. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Labor organization." An organization or agency or employee
- 16 representation committee, plan or arrangement in which employees
- 17 participate and which exists for the purpose of dealing with
- 18 employers concerning grievances, labor disputes, wages, rates of
- 19 pay, hours of employment or conditions of work.
- 20 "Person." An individual, corporation, association, company,
- 21 firm or labor organization.
- 22 Section 3. Prohibited conditions of employment.
- 23 (a) Membership. -- A person may not be required to become or
- 24 remain a member of a labor organization as a condition of
- 25 employment or continuation of employment.
- 26 (b) Abstention from membership.--A person may not be
- 27 required to abstain or refrain from membership in a labor
- 28 organization as a condition of employment or continuation of
- 29 employment.
- 30 (c) Dues, fees and charges. -- A person may not be required to

- 1 pay or refrain from paying any dues, fees or other charges of
- 2 any kind to a labor organization as a condition of employment or
- 3 continuation of employment.
- 4 Section 4. Penalty.
- 5 A person commits a misdemeanor of the third degree, and
- 6 shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more
- 7 than \$1,000 or to imprisonment for not more than six months, or
- 8 both, with each day of violation constituting a separate
- 9 offense, if the person does any of the following:
- 10 (1) Directly or indirectly places upon any other person
- any requirement or compulsion prohibited by this act.
- 12 (2) Makes any agreement, written or oral, express or
- implied, to violate paragraph (1).
- 14 (3) Engages in any lockout, layoff, strike, work
- stoppage, slowdown, picketing, boycott or other action or
- 16 conduct that has the purpose or effect of imposing upon any
- person, directly or indirectly, any requirement or compulsion
- 18 prohibited by this act.
- 19 Section 5. Relief.
- Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a person
- 21 injured or threatened with injury by any action or conduct
- 22 prohibited by this act shall be entitled to injunctive relief
- 23 and to damages for any injuries sustained.
- 24 Section 6. Repeals.
- 25 All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar as they are
- 26 inconsistent with this act.
- 27 Section 7. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
