## AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in riot, disorderly conduct and 2 related offenses, further providing for the offense of cruelty to animals. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Section 5511(a)(2.1)(i), (c) and (q) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 8 § 5511. Cruelty to animals. (a) Killing, maiming or poisoning domestic animals or zoo 10 11 animals, etc. --\* \* \* 12 13 (2.1) (i) A person commits a misdemeanor of the first 14 degree if he [willfully]: 15 (A) Willfully and maliciously: 16 [(A)] <u>(I)</u> Kills, maims, mutilates, tortures 17 or disfigures any dog or cat, whether belonging 18 to himself or otherwise. If a person kills,

maims, mutilates, tortures or disfigures a dog guide for an individual who is blind, a hearing dog for an individual who is deaf or audibly impaired or a service dog for an individual who is physically limited, whether belonging to the individual or otherwise, that person, in addition to any other applicable penalty, shall be required to make reparations for veterinary costs in treating the dog and, if necessary, the cost of obtaining and training a replacement dog.

[(B)] <u>(II)</u> Administers poison to or exposes any poisonous substance with the intent to administer such poison to any dog or cat, whether belonging to himself or otherwise.

## (B) Commits a violation of subsection (c) (1) that results in the death of the cat or dog.

- 18 (c) Cruelty to animals.-
  - cruelly illtreats, overloads, beats, otherwise abuses any animal, or neglects any animal as to which he has a duty of care, whether belonging to himself or otherwise, or abandons any animal, or deprives any animal of necessary sustenance, drink, shelter or veterinary care, or access to clean and sanitary shelter which will protect the animal against inclement weather and preserve the animal's body heat and keep it dry.
    - (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii), a person convicted of violating paragraph (1) commits a summary offense.

- 1 A person convicted for a second or subsequent 2 time of violating paragraph (1) commits a misdemeanor of 3 the [third] second degree [if all of the following 4 occurred: 5 The action or omission for which the person (A) 6 was convicted for a subsequent time was performed on 7 a dog or cat. 8 The dog or cat was seriously injured, 9 suffered severe physical distress or was placed at imminent risk of serious physical harm as the result 10 of the person's action or omission]. 11 12 (3) [This subsection shall not apply to activity 13 undertaken in normal agricultural operation.] A person 14 commits aggravated cruelty to animals when, with no justifiable purpose, he intentionally kills or intentionally 15 causes serious physical injury to a companion animal with 16 17 aggravated cruelty. 18 (4) A person convicted of violating paragraph (3) 19 commits a misdemeanor of the first degree. 20 (5) Nothing contained in this section shall be construed 21 to prohibit activity undertaken in normal agricultural 22 operation or interfere in any way with anyone lawfully 23 engaged in hunting, trapping or fishing, the dispatch of 24 rabid or diseased animals or the dispatch of animals posing a 25 threat to human safety or other animals, where such action is 26 otherwise legally authorized.

- 28 (q) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 29 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 30 subsection:

- 1 <u>"Aggravated cruelty." Conduct which:</u>
- 2 (1) is intended to cause extreme physical pain; or
- 3 (2) is done or carried out in an especially depraved or
- 4 <u>sadistic manner</u>.
- 5 "Animal fighting." Fighting or baiting any bull, bear, dog,
- 6 cock or other creature.
- 7 "Animal fighting paraphernalia." Any device, implement,
- 8 object or drug used or intended to be used for animal fighting,
- 9 to train an animal for animal fighting or in furtherance of
- 10 animal fighting. In determining whether an object is animal
- 11 fighting paraphernalia, a court or other authority should
- 12 consider statements by an owner or by anyone in control of the
- 13 object concerning its use, any prior convictions under Federal
- 14 or State law relating to animal fighting, the proximity of the
- 15 object in time and space to the direct violation of this
- 16 section, direct or circumstantial evidence of the intent of the
- 17 accused to deliver the object to persons whom he or she knows or
- 18 should reasonably know intends to use the object to facilitate a
- 19 violation of this section, oral or written instructions provided
- 20 with or in the vicinity of the object concerning its use,
- 21 descriptive materials accompanying the object which explain or
- 22 depict its use and all other logically relevant factors.
- 23 "Audibly impaired." The inability to hear air conduction
- 24 thresholds at an average of 40 decibels or greater in the better
- 25 ear.
- 26 "Blind." Having a visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the
- 27 better eye with correction or having a limitation of the field
- 28 of vision such that the widest diameter of the visual field
- 29 subtends an angular distance not greater than 20 degrees.
- 30 "Conveyance." A truck, tractor, trailer or semitrailer, or

- 1 any combination of these, propelled or drawn by mechanical
- 2 power.
- 3 "Deaf." Totally impaired hearing or hearing with or without
- 4 amplification which is so seriously impaired that the primary
- 5 means of receiving spoken language is through other sensory
- 6 input, including, but not limited to, lip reading, sign
- 7 language, finger spelling or reading.
- 8 "Domestic animal." Any dog, cat, equine animal, bovine
- 9 animal, sheep, goat or porcine animal.
- 10 "Domestic fowl." Any avis raised for food, hobby or sport.
- "Equine animal." Any member of the Equidae family, which
- 12 includes horses, asses, mules, ponies and zebras.
- "Normal agricultural operation." Normal activities,
- 14 practices and procedures that farmers adopt, use or engage in
- 15 year after year in the production and preparation for market of
- 16 poultry, livestock and their products in the production and
- 17 harvesting of agricultural, agronomic, horticultural,
- 18 silvicultural and aquicultural crops and commodities.
- 19 "Physically limited." Having limited ambulation, including,
- 20 but not limited to, a temporary or permanent impairment or
- 21 condition that causes an individual to use a wheelchair or walk
- 22 with difficulty or insecurity, affects sight or hearing to the
- 23 extent that an individual is insecure or exposed to danger,
- 24 causes faulty coordination or reduces mobility, flexibility,
- 25 coordination or perceptiveness.
- 26 "Zoo animal." Any member of the class of mammalia, aves,
- 27 amphibia or reptilia which is kept in a confined area by a
- 28 public body or private individual for purposes of observation by
- 29 the general public.
- 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
