AN ACT

Amending the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), entitled "An act providing for a State Lottery and administration 2 thereof; authorizing the creation of a State Lottery Commission; prescribing its powers and duties; disposition of funds; violations and penalties therefor; exemption of prizes 5 from State and local taxation and making an appropriation," 6 in pharmaceutical assistance for the elderly, further 7 providing for definitions, providing for medication synchronization, further providing for the Pharmaceutical 9 Assistance Contract for the Elderly Needs Enhancement Tier 10 and for board and, providing for medication therapy 11 <-management AND FURTHER PROVIDING FOR COORDINATION OF 12 <--13 BENEFITS. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 15 hereby enacts as follows: 16 Section 1. The definition of "board" in section 502 of the 17 act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law, is amended and the section is amended by adding a <--18 19 definition DEFINITIONS to read: <--

- PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE OF AT LEAST 63 CONSECUTIVE DAYS

- 19 "MAINTENANCE MEDICATION." A MEDICATION PRESCRIBED FOR A
- 20 CHRONIC, LONG-TERM CONDITION AND TAKEN ON A REGULAR, RECURRING
- 21 BASIS.
- 22 <u>"Medication synchronization."</u> The coordination of
- 23 prescription drug filling or refilling by a pharmacy or
- 24 dispensing physician for a program participant taking two or
- 25 more medications for the purpose of improving medication
- 26 adherence.

- 28 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 29 Section 515.1. Medication synchronization.
- 30 <u>(a) Prorated daily cost-sharing rate FEES.--The program</u>

- 1 shall permit and apply a prorated daily cost-sharing rate FEE to <--
- 2 prescription drugs that are dispensed by a pharmacy for less
- 3 than a 30 days' supply if the pharmacist or prescriber
- 4 <u>determines the fill or refill to be in the best interest of the</u>
- 5 program participant and the program participant requests or
- 6 agrees to less than a 30 days' supply for the purpose of
- 7 medication synchronization. THE PROGRAM MAY NOT USE PAYMENT <--
- 8 STRUCTURES INCORPORATING PRORATED DISPENSING FEES.
- 9 (B) FULL PAYMENT.--DISPENSING FEES FOR A PARTIAL SUPPLY OR
- 10 REFILLED PRESCRIPTION SHALL BE PAID IN FULL FOR EACH MAINTENANCE
- 11 MEDICATION DISPENSED, REGARDLESS OF ANY PRORATED COPAY FOR THE
- 12 BENEFICIARY OR FEE PAID FOR ALIGNMENT SERVICES.
- 13 (C) PARTIAL SUPPLY.--THE PROGRAM MAY NOT DENY COVERAGE FOR
- 14 THE DISPENSING OF A MAINTENANCE MEDICATION THAT IS DISPENSED BY
- 15 A NETWORK PHARMACY ON THE BASIS THAT THE DISPENSING IS FOR A
- 16 PARTIAL SUPPLY IF THE PRESCRIBER OR PHARMACIST DETERMINES THE
- 17 FILL OR REFILL IS IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE PATIENT AND THE
- 18 PATIENT REQUESTS OR AGREES TO A PARTIAL SUPPLY FOR THE PURPOSE
- 19 OF MEDICATION SYNCHRONIZATION.
- 20 (D) ANNUAL LIMITATION. -- THE FILL OR REFILL UNDER THIS
- 21 SECTION SHALL BE LIMITED TO THREE TIMES A YEAR FOR EACH
- 22 MAINTENANCE MEDICATION FOR A COVERED INDIVIDUAL. FOR EACH
- 23 CLINICALLY NECESSARY SYNCHRONIZATION THEREAFTER, APPROVAL MAY BE
- 24 REQUIRED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE PROGRAM.
- 25 (b) (E) Override of denial codes.--The SUBJECT TO SECTION <
- 26 520(C.1), THE program shall allow a pharmacy to override any
- 27 denial codes indicating that a prescription drug is being
- 28 refilled too soon for the purposes of medication
- 29 synchronization- UTILIZING THE SUBMISSION CLARIFICATION AND
- 30 MESSAGE CODES AS ADOPTED BY THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR

- 1 PRESCRIPTION DRUG PROGRAMS OR ALTERNATIVE CODES PROVIDED BY THE
- 2 PROGRAM.
- 3 (F) EXEMPTION.--THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO PRESCRIPTION

- 6 <u>SYNCHRONIZATION IS NOT POSSIBLE; OR</u>

- 16 (b) PACENET eligibility. -- A person with an annual income of
- 17 not less than \$14,500 and not more than [\$23,500] $\frac{$31,000}{}$

- 28 (a) Establishment.--The Pharmaceutical Assistance [Review]
- 29 Advisory Board is continued to ensure that the program is
- 30 providing and continues to provide the assistance intended in a

- 1 fiscally responsible manner without excessively hampering the
- 2 pharmaceutical industry.
- 3 (b) Composition. -- The board shall be comprised of the
- 4 following [eight] persons:
- 5 (1) The Secretary of Aging, who shall serve as its 6 chairman.
- 7 (2) The Secretary of Revenue.
- 8 (3) The Secretary of Health.
- 9 (4) [Five] <u>Nine</u> public members[, one appointed by the
- 10 President pro tempore of the Senate, one appointed by the
- 11 Minority Leader of the Senate, one appointed by the Speaker
- of the House of Representatives, one appointed by the
- 13 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives and one
- 14 appointed by the Governor. Those appointed by the legislative
- officers shall include two senior citizens who have not been
- a part of the pharmaceutical industry to serve as consumer
- 17 advocates, one representative of the pharmaceutical industry
- 18 and one practicing Pennsylvania pharmacist. The individual
- 19 appointed by the Governor must be a physician. A public
- 20 member who misses two consecutive meetings without good cause
- 21 acceptable to the chairman shall be replaced by the

11	be senior advocates.
12	(5) Should a board vacancy not be filled by the
13	appointing authority within 60 days, the power to appoint an
14	individual to the vacancy shall be given to the Secretary of
15	Aging.
16	(c) ReviewUsing the annual report submitted by the
17	department pursuant to section 2102 and other appropriate data
18	sources, the board shall conduct an annual review. The board
19	shall develop recommendations concerning any changes in the
20	level of copayment[,] OR deductible [or in the level of fees <
21	paid to participating pharmacists]. The board shall review the <
22	department's therapeutic drug utilization review program on an
23	ongoing basis. The board may also recommend other changes in the
24	structure of the program and direct the department to enter into
25	discussions with the private contractor concerning amendments to
26	the contract, or the department may enter into such discussion
27	if it deems necessary. The copayment or deductible schedule
28	shall only be adjusted on an annual basis.
