AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; providing for the regulation of pari-mutuel thoroughbred horse racing and harness horse racing 18 activities, imposing certain taxes and providing for the 19 disposition of funds from pari-mutuel tickets; and 20 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 21 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 22 23 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," in Commonwealth budget procedures, providing for 24 essential service payments during budget impasse. 25 26 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 27 hereby enacts as follows: The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 28 Section 1.
- 29 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a

- 2 Section 626. Essential Service Payments During Budget
- 3 Impasse. -- (a) If the General Appropriation Act is not enacted by
- 4 July 1 of any fiscal year:
- 5 (1) The Secretary of the Budget shall, in consultation
- 6 <u>with the Secretary of Human Services, the Secretary of Drug</u>
- 7 and Alcohol Programs and the Secretary of Aging, certify to
- 8 <u>the State Treasurer the line items and amounts paid for</u>
- 9 <u>essential services from each of their departments during the</u>
- 10 prior fiscal year and the amounts so certified are hereby
- 11 appropriated from the General Fund to the respective
- departments for those purposes.
- 13 (2) The Department of Human Services, the Department of
- 14 <u>Drug and Alcohol Programs and the Department of Aging may</u>
- 15 <u>submit requisitions to the State Treasurer for the payment of</u>
- the essential services to a human services organization,
- 17 county or other intermediary organization from the
- 18 appropriations made under paragraph (1), provided that the
- 19 amount paid does not exceed the amount paid during the prior
- 20 <u>fiscal year.</u>
- 21 (b) The payments authorized under subsection (a) to a human
- 22 <u>service organization</u>, county or other intermediary organization
- 23 shall include reimbursement of interest incurred by the human
- 24 <u>service organization</u>, county or other intermediary organization
- 25 for providing essential services in this Commonwealth, if the
- 26 <u>interest was incurred on a loan issued by a financial</u>
- 27 <u>institution to the human service organization, county or other</u>
- 28 <u>intermediary organization and the organization demonstrates in</u>
- 29 writing to the satisfaction of the Secretary of the Budget that
- 30 the loan was necessary to support the operations of the

- 1 organization as a direct result of not receiving timely payment
- 2 from the Commonwealth after July 1 of the fiscal year.
- 3 (c) The amount paid from the General Fund under subsection
- 4 (a) between July 1 and the date of enactment of the General
- 5 Appropriation Act for that fiscal year shall be credited against
- 6 the corresponding appropriation in the General Appropriation Act
- 7 <u>for that fiscal year.</u>
- 8 (d) An appropriation made under subsection (a) in any fiscal
- 9 year shall immediately lapse when the General Appropriation Act
- 10 for that fiscal year is enacted.
- 11 (e) The Secretary of the Budget and the State Treasurer
- 12 <u>shall expedite payments under this section consistent with their</u>
- 13 powers and duties in the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176),
- 14 <u>known as "The Fiscal Code."</u>
- 15 (f) As used in this section, the term "essential service"
- 16 means any service for which payment was made during the previous
- 17 fiscal year from Federal and State appropriations to the
- 18 Department of Human Services, the Department of Drug and Alcohol
- 19 Programs and the Department of Aging for the following:
- 20 (1) Domestic violence.
- 21 (2) Mental health services, including grants to counties
- 22 or other county-based human services included under the Human
- 23 <u>Services Block Grant Pilot Program, exclusive of capital</u>
- improvements.
- 25 (3) Behavioral health services or other county-based
- human services included under the Human Services Block Grant
- 27 <u>Pilot Program.</u>
- 28 (4) Intellectual Disabilities Community Base Program,
- 29 <u>including grants to counties for noninstitutional programs or</u>
- 30 other county-based human services included under the Human

1	Services Block Grant Pilot Program, exclusive of capital
2	<u>improvements.</u>
3	(5) Payments and services to counties for children and
4	youth programs and for the care of delinquent and dependent
5	children or other county-based human services included under
6	the Human Services Block Grant Pilot Program. The payments
7	and services under the Human Services Block Grant Pilot
8	Program include an aggregate child welfare needs-based budget
9	allocation that the Department of Human Services may use to
10	fund contracts for adoption services and the Department of
11	Human Services may use to pay for assistance to counties in
12	meeting Federal reimbursement documentation requirements.
13	(6) The Human Services Development Fund.
14	(7) Medical assistance payments for outpatient services,
15	exclusive of outpatient services provided through capitation
16	plans.
17	(8) Payments to counties for drug and alcohol addiction
18	treatment services under section 2334.
19	(9) Any other funds for which the county provides
20	services on behalf of the Commonwealth.
21	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
