1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," further providing for definitions; and providing for pharmacy technician and pharmacy technician trainee registration, qualifications and supervision.
9	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. Section 2 of the act of September 27, 1961
12	(P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, is amended by
13	adding clauses to read:
14	Section 2. DefinitionsAs used in this act:
15	* * *
16	(20) "Pharmacy technician" means an individual who:
17	(i) is registered with the board as a pharmacy technician;
18	and
19	(ii) may assist in the practice of pharmacy under the direct
20	and immediate personal supervision of a licensed pharmacist

1	after meeting the requirements of this act and the regulations	
2	promulgated under this act.	
3	(21) "Pharmacy technician trainee" means an individual who	
4	has been issued a temporary permit by the board that authorizes	
5	the individual to perform the duties of a pharmacy technician	
6	under the direct and immediate personal supervision of a	
7	licensed pharmacist.	
8	(22) "Direct and immediate personal supervision" means:	
9	(i) review by the pharmacist of the prescription or drug	
10	order prior to dispensing;	
11	(ii) verification by the pharmacist of the final product;	
12	and	
13	(iii) immediate availability of the pharmacist on the	
14	premises to direct the work of the supervised individual and to	
15	respond to questions or problems.	
16	Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:	
17	Section 3.3. Pharmacy Technician and Pharmacy Technician	
18	Trainee Registration, Qualifications and Supervision(a) A	
19	pharmacy technician shall register with the board biennially on	
20	a form prescribed by the board and pay a registration fee	
21	established by the board by regulation. An individual must	
22	possess an unrestricted registration from the board to practice	
23	as a pharmacy technician. The following shall apply:	
24	(1) A pharmacy technician shall be responsible to and under	
25	the direct and immediate personal supervision of a board-	
26	licensed pharmacist.	
27	(2) A registration for a pharmacy technician may not be	
28	issued if the applicant is unfit or unable to practice under	
29	section 3(a)(2) or has been convicted of an offense described	
30	under section 3(a)(6) in this Commonwealth or another state.	
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1	(3) An applicant for pharmacy technician registration shall	
2	meet the following requirements:	
3	(i) Be at least seventeen years of age and possess a high	
4	<u>school diploma or equivalent.</u>	
5	(ii) Complete a board-approved pharmacy technician training	
6	program.	
7	(iii) Submit to a criminal history record check as required	
8	by the board.	
9	(4) An individual currently practicing as a pharmacy	
10	technician on or before the effective date of this section shall	
11	not be required to comply with clause (3)(i) or (ii).	
12	(5) The board shall renew, revoke or suspend the	
13	registration of pharmacy technicians under regulations	
14	promulgated by the board. This clause is subject to 2 Pa.C.S.	
15	Chs. 5 Subch. A (relating to practice and procedure of	
16	Commonwealth agencies) and 7 Subch. A (relating to judicial	
17	review of Commonwealth agency action).	
18	(6) Except as provided for in clause (7), or unless ordered	
19	to do so by a court of proper jurisdiction, the board may not	
20	reinstate the registration of an individual whose registration	
21	to practice as a pharmacy technician has been revoked or if the	
22	individual is unfit or unable to practice under section 3(a)(2)	
23	or has been convicted of an offense described under section 3(a)	
24	<u>(6).</u>	
25	(7) If an individual desires to practice after revocation,	
26	the individual must apply for registration after the lapse of a	
27	five-year period and in accordance with this section and	
28	regulations.	
29	(8) A pharmacy technician shall wear a name tag that clearly	
30	identifies the pharmacy technician's first name with the title	
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1 <u>"Registered Pharmacy Technician."</u>

2	(b) Upon the submission of a board-approved written	
3	application and fee, the board may issue a temporary permit to	
4	practice as a pharmacy technician trainee. The following shall	
5	apply:	
6	(1) A pharmacy technician trainee shall be responsible to	
7	and under the direct and immediate personal supervision of a	
8	board-licensed pharmacist.	
9	(2) A registration for a pharmacy technician trainee may not	
10	be issued if the applicant is unfit or unable to practice under	
11	section 3(a)(2) or has been convicted of an offense described	
12	under section 3(a)(6) in this Commonwealth or another state.	
13	(3) An applicant for pharmacy technician trainee	
14	registration shall meet the following requirements:	
15	<u>(i) Be at least sixteen years of age.</u>	
16	(ii) Submit to a criminal history record check as required	
17	by the board.	
18	(4) The board shall issue only one temporary permit to an	
19	applicant and the temporary permit shall expire one year after	
20	the date of issue and may be renewed for one additional year.	
21	(5) Upon expiration of the temporary permit, the applicant	
22	shall promptly return the permit to the board.	
23	(6) A pharmacy technician trainee shall wear a name tag that	
24	clearly identifies the pharmacy technician trainee's first name	
25	with the title "Pharmacy Technician Trainee."	
26	Section 3. No person is required to register as a pharmacy	
27	technician under section 3.3 of the act until one year after the	
28	State Board of Pharmacy has promulgated final regulations.	
29	Section 4. Within 18 months of the effective date of this	
30	act, the State Board of Pharmacy shall promulgate final	
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- 1 regulations to implement this act.
- 2 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
