1 2 3 4	Imposing a duty on the Department of Environmental Protection to maintain a system for applicants to track the status of certain permit applications; and providing for permit notifications.				
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania				
6	hereby enacts as follows:				
7	Section 1. Short title.				
8	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania				
9	Permit Tracking and Notification Law.				
10	Section 2. Definitions.				
11	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall				
12	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the				
13	context clearly indicates otherwise:				
14	"Applicant." An individual, partnership, association,				
15	company, corporation, municipality, municipal authority,				
16	political subdivision or an agency of Federal or State				
17	government that submits an application for a permit to conduct				

1 an activity authorized by the department.

2 "Application manager." The specific department staff member
3 who is responsible for the processing of an application and is
4 the primary contact for the project review.

5 "Complete and technically adequate application." An 6 application package that includes all necessary documents and 7 information and is provided in sufficient detail to perform a 8 technical review.

9 "Completeness review." A process by which department staff 10 review applications to determine if the applications are 11 complete and technically adequate and comply with applicable 12 regulatory and statutory requirements.

13 "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of 14 the Commonwealth.

"Permit." Authorization issued by the department or under a delegated agreement by the department giving approval to perform a regulated activity. The term includes a permit, plan approval and registration under a general permit. The definition does not include a certification or license.

"Processing time." The total number of business days allowed, whether by statute, regulation or department policy, beginning with the acceptance of a complete and technically adequate application and ending with the final action by the department. The length of time does not begin until the application passes completeness review and the application is determined to be complete and technically adequate.

27 "Project." A permit required by the department for any of 28 the following:

(1) Construction, reconstruction, conversion, structural
 alteration, relocation or enlargement of a building or other

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1 structure.

2 (2) Site preparation, including grading, earth moving
3 activities, clearance, soil removal or movement, timber
4 harvesting relocation, excavation, landfill and moving,
5 depositing or storing soil, rock or earth materials.

6 (3) Use or change in the use of a building or other 7 structure or change in land use.

8 (4) Land development as defined in section 107 of the 9 act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.805, No.247), known as the 10 Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, or land use.

11 (5) Demolition, moving or removing a building or other 12 structure.

13 "Technical review." A review of the technical aspects of a 14 permit application to determine if the permit application meets 15 regulatory and statutory requirements for permit issuance. 16 Section 3. Permit tracking.

17 The department shall maintain a secure system available to 18 applicants for tracking the status of permit applications on the 19 department's publicly accessible Internet website. The system 20 shall include:

(1) The processing time provided for each permit and a
 citation of relevant statutory, regulatory or department
 policy establishing the processing time.

(2) The dates associated with receipt, completeness
review, technical review, elevated review process, if
necessary, and final permit decision.

27 (3) An estimate of time remaining for each incomplete28 phase of the approval process.

29 (4) Identification of the application manager and
 30 appropriate contact information for department staff assigned

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1 to answer relevant applicant questions.

2 Section 4. Permit notifications.

3 The department shall provide electronic notifications to 4 permit holders 60 days before the permit's expiration date and 5 when there are changes in:

6 (1) Statutes or regulations that impact the permit.
7 (2) Permit fees that affect the renewal of a permit.
8 Section 5. Prior permits.

9 A project permit issued prior to the effective date of a 10 statute or regulation altering the requirements for the same 11 project permit shall remain valid under the provisions by which 12 the permit was granted until the project is completed. 13 Section 6. Effective date.

14 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
