AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of aggravated assault.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 2702(d) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended and subsection (c) is amended
- 8 by adding a paragraph to read:
- 9 § 2702. Aggravated assault.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (c) Officers, employees, etc., enumerated.--The officers,
- 12 agents, employees and other persons referred to in subsection
- 13 (a) shall be as follows:
- 14 * * *
- 15 <u>(39) A health care practitioner.</u>
- 16 (d) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 17 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 18 subsection:

- 1 "Electric or electronic incapacitation device." A portable
- 2 device which is designed or intended by the manufacturer to be
- 3 used, offensively or defensively, to temporarily immobilize or
- 4 incapacitate persons by means of electric pulse or current,
- 5 including devices operated by means of carbon dioxide
- 6 propellant. The term does not include cattle prods, electric
- 7 fences or other electric devices when used in agricultural,
- 8 animal husbandry or food production activities.
- 9 "Emergency medical services personnel." The term includes,
- 10 but is not limited to, doctors, residents, interns, registered
- 11 nurses, licensed practical nurses, nurse aides, ambulance
- 12 attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical
- 13 technicians and members of a hospital security force while
- 14 working within the scope of their employment.
- 15 <u>"Health care practitioner." As defined in section 103 of the</u>
- 16 act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care
- 17 Facilities Act.
- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
