## AN ACT

- Relating to the delivery of services and programs to persons 1 with disabilities; conferring powers and duties on the Office 2 of the Governor; establishing the Office for People with 3 Disabilities, Cabinet for People with Disabilities and Advisory Committee for People with Disabilities; and providing for their powers, duties and funding. 6

- 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- 11 CHAPTER 1
- 12 PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS
- 13 Section 101. Short title.
- 14 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Office for
- 15 People with Disabilities Act.
- 16 Section 102. Definitions.
- 17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 18 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 20 "Advisory committee." The Advisory Committee for People with
- 21 Disabilities established by this act.
- "Cabinet." The Governor's Cabinet for People with
- 23 Disabilities established by this act.
- "Office." The Office for People with Disabilities
- 25 established by this act.
- 26 "Person with a disability." A child or adult in this
- 27 Commonwealth who has a physical or mental impairment that
- 28 substantially limits one or more major life activities.
- 29 CHAPTER 3
- 30 OFFICE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

- 1 Section 301. Establishment.
- 2 The Office for People with Disabilities is established within
- 3 the Office of the Governor. The office shall be administered by
- 4 the Office of the Governor.
- 5 Section 302. Powers and duties of office.
- 6 The office shall:
- 7 (1) Make recommendations to the Governor on policies,
- 8 procedures, regulations and legislation that aid people with
- 9 disabilities in this Commonwealth.
- 10 (2) Serve as the Governor's liaison to people with
- 11 disabilities on policies, procedures, regulations and
- 12 legislation that affect people with disabilities to ensure
- 13 that State government is accessible, accountable and
- responsive to people with disabilities.
- 15 (3) Serve as a resource to State agencies under the
- Governor's jurisdiction to ensure that the agencies are
- 17 cognizant of the needs of people with disabilities and that
- their respective services and programs are accessible to
- 19 those individuals.
- 20 (4) Work with the Governor and State agencies to ensure
- 21 the efficient and effective delivery of services to people
- 22 with disabilities by:
- 23 (i) Facilitating cooperation among State agencies as
- 24 to their disability-related functions.
- 25 (ii) Serving as a liaison between the advisory
- 26 committee and State agencies.
- 27 (5) Work with the Governor and State agencies to advance
- the hiring, retention and promotion practices of the
- 29 Commonwealth relating to the employment of people with
- 30 disabilities to ensure that there are no discriminatory

- 1 practices.
- 2 (6) Employ an executive director to carry out the duties
- 3 of this section, who shall have the additional duty of
- 4 arranging for meetings of the cabinet, the advisory committee
- 5 and, upon request of the advisory committee chairperson,
- 6 joint meetings of the two bodies.
- 7 CHAPTER 5
- 8 GOVERNOR'S CABINET FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES
- 9 Section 501. Establishment.
- 10 The Governor's Cabinet for People with Disabilities is
- 11 established.
- 12 Section 502. Membership.
- 13 The cabinet shall consist of the following members, or their
- 14 designees, who shall serve by virtue of their public position:
- 15 (1) Secretary of Human Services.
- 16 (2) Secretary of Labor and Industry.
- 17 (3) Secretary of Health.
- 18 (4) Secretary of Education.
- 19 (5) Secretary of Transportation.
- 20 (6) Secretary of the Budget.
- 21 (7) Secretary of Aging.
- 22 (8) Secretary of Policy and Planning.
- 23 (9) Adjutant General.
- 24 (10) Secretary of the Commonwealth.
- 25 (11) Chairperson of the Pennsylvania Human Relations
- 26 Commission.
- 27 (12) Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Housing
- 28 Finance Agency.
- 29 (13) Executive Director of the Pennsylvania
- 30 Developmental Disabilities Planning Council.

- 1 (14) Executive Director of the Office for People with
- 2 Disabilities.
- 3 (15) Executive Director of the Intra-Governmental
- 4 Council on Long-Term Care.
- 5 Section 503. Responsibilities of cabinet.
- 6 (a) Responsibilities. -- The responsibilities of the cabinet
- 7 are as follows:
- 8 (1) To make recommendations on policies, procedures,
- 9 regulations and legislation that aid people with disabilities
- in this Commonwealth to the Governor based upon
- 11 recommendations, resolutions and other information received
- 12 by the advisory committee.
- 13 (2) To meet no less that twice annually to consider
- 14 recommendations from the advisory committee and other
- 15 disability-related matters.
- 16 (b) Chairperson. -- The members of the cabinet shall elect a
- 17 chairperson from among the members, who shall serve in that
- 18 capacity until a successor is appointed.
- 19 CHAPTER 7
- 20 ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES
- 21 Section 701. Establishment.
- 22 The Advisory Committee for People with Disabilities is
- 23 established within the Office for People with Disabilities.
- 24 Section 702. Responsibilities.
- 25 The advisory committee shall serve in an advisory capacity to
- 26 the cabinet in matters regarding people with disabilities in
- 27 this Commonwealth.
- 28 Section 703. Membership.
- 29 (a) Members. -- The advisory committee shall consist of
- 30 members appointed as follows:

- 1 (1) The Governor shall appoint persons with
- 2 disabilities, including individuals from existing stakeholder
- groups, in a number as the Governor deems appropriate.
- 4 (2) At a minimum, 60% of the members shall be persons
- 5 with disabilities or family members of persons with
- 6 disabilities.
- 7 (3) Members shall be selected based upon an evaluation
- 8 of information received through formal application.
- 9 (4) Members appointed shall serve at the pleasure of the
- 10 Governor as long as they represent the interest of the
- 11 membership class for which they were appointed and shall
- 12 serve until their successors are appointed.
- 13 (b) Chairperson. -- The members of the advisory committee
- 14 shall elect a chairperson from among the members. Ballots may be
- 15 cast either in person or by proxy.
- 16 (c) Expenses of members. -- The executive director shall make
- 17 every effort to minimize the cost of meetings through the use of
- 18 videoconferencing or other electronic meeting devices. Members
- 19 of the advisory committee shall receive no compensation for
- 20 their services. Members who are not employees of State
- 21 government shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the
- 22 course of their duties in accordance with Commonwealth policy.
- 23 (d) Studies and reports. -- The advisory committee may conduct
- 24 studies and issue reports upon request and as it deems necessary
- 25 on issues affecting persons with disabilities in this
- 26 Commonwealth.
- 27 (e) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall be
- 28 construed to prevent the advisory committee from establishing ad
- 29 hoc work groups or local committees to assist in research and
- 30 other duties necessary to carry out the mission of the advisory

- 1 committee and the office.
- 2 (f) Work with cabinet. -- The cabinet and the advisory
- 3 committee shall meet jointly at least once a year. The advisory
- 4 committee may request additional joint meetings with the cabinet
- 5 to facilitate communications. Representatives of the cabinet
- 6 shall attend advisory committee meetings.
- 7 (q) Existing committees. -- The establishment of the advisory
- 8 committee is not intended to replace an existing committee that
- 9 performs a similar advisory function.
- 10 CHAPTER 9
- 11 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
- 12 Section 901. Responsibilities of State agencies.
- 13 State agencies shall cooperate with and provide necessary
- 14 assistance to the cabinet and advisory committee in performing
- 15 their functions.
- 16 Section 902. Cooperation.
- 17 In implementing this act, the cabinet and advisory committee
- 18 shall utilize existing resources available through the
- 19 Commonwealth and donated resources of members before incurring
- 20 additional expenses.
- 21 Section 903. Funding.
- 22 The Office of the Governor shall use Federal funds where
- 23 possible for the administration of the Office for People with
- 24 Disabilities, the Governor's Cabinet for People with
- 25 Disabilities and the Advisory Committee for People with
- 26 Disabilities and shall expend Federal funds, on appropriation by
- 27 the General Assembly, prior to expending any State
- 28 appropriations for the same or similar purpose. The Office of
- 29 the Governor shall utilize any available private funds to carry
- 30 out the provisions of this act.

- 1 Section 904. Abrogation of executive order.
- 2 This act shall abrogate Executive Order 2006-09, establishing
- 3 the Governor's Cabinet for People with Disabilities and the
- 4 Governor's Advisory Committee for People with Disabilities.
- 5 Section 905. Effective date.
- 6 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
