AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, in licensing of drivers, further providing for
- 3 classes of licenses.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 1504 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 8 § 1504. Classes of licenses.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (f) Penalty. -- A person who violates subsection (a) commits a
- 11 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay
- 12 <u>a fine of up to \$200, except that, if the person charged</u>
- 13 <u>furnishes satisfactory proof of having held the proper class of</u>
- 14 <u>license valid on the last day of the preceding driver's license</u>
- 15 period and no more than six months has elapsed from the last
- 16 date for renewal, the fine shall be \$25. No person charged with
- 17 violating subsection (a) shall be convicted if the person

- 1 produces at the office of the issuing authority within 15 days
- 2 of the violation:
- 3 (1) a valid driver's license for the type or class of
- 4 <u>vehicle being driven in this Commonwealth at the time of the</u>
- 5 violation; or
- 6 (2) if the driver's license is lost, stolen, destroyed
- or illegible, evidence that the driver was licensed for the
- 8 type or class of vehicle being driven at the time of the
- 9 violation.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
