19	(c) Agency discretionAn agency may exercise its
20	discretion to make any otherwise exempt record accessible for
21	inspection and copying under this chapter, if all of the

2 (1) Disclosure of the record is not prohibited under any3 of the following:

4 (i) Federal or State law or regulation.

5 (ii) Judicial order or decree.

6 (2) The record is not protected by a privilege.

7 (3) The agency head determines that the public interest
8 favoring access outweighs any individual, agency or public
9 interest that may favor restriction of access.

10 (4) The record does not contain a person's Social

14 Section 706. Redaction.

15 (a) General rule.--If an agency determines that a public record, legislative record or financial record contains 16 17 information which is subject to access as well as information 18 which is not subject to access, the agency's response shall 19 grant access to the information which is subject to access and 20 deny access to the information which is not subject to access. 21 If the information which is not subject to access is an integral 22 part of the public record, legislative record or financial 23 record and cannot be separated, the agency shall redact from the 24 record the information which is not subject to access, and the 25 response shall grant access to the information which is subject 26 to access. The agency may not deny access to the record if the 27 information which is not subject to access is able to be 28 redacted. Information which an agency redacts in accordance with 29 this subsection shall be deemed a denial under Chapter 9. (b) Social Security numbers. -- If an agency determines that a 30

9	accessible Internet website. An agency shall, within six months
10	of the effective date of this subsection, redact all Social
11	Security numbers from records made available on a publicly
12	accessible Internet website owned, operated or controlled by the
13	agency or a party with whom the agency has contracted to own,
14	operate or control the publicly accessible Internet website.
15	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
