## AN ACT

Amending the act of September 9, 1965 (P.L.497, No.251), entitled, as amended, "An act requiring physicians, hospitals 2 and other institutions to administer or cause to be 3 administered tests for genetic diseases upon infants in 4 certain cases," further providing for newborn child screening 5 and follow-up program. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 3(d) of the act of September 9, 1965 10 (P.L.497, No.251), known as the Newborn Child Testing Act, is amended to read: 11 12 Section 3. Newborn Child Screening and Follow-up Program. --\* 13 (1) The department, with the approval of the Newborn 14 Screening and Follow-up Technical Advisory Committee, shall 15 16 [establish,] by periodic publication in the Pennsylvania 17 Bulletin[, changes to the lists under subsection (a)(1) and (2) of those diseases for which newborn children shall be screened 18 19 and laboratory screening results reported.]:

(i) Add diseases to the lists under subsection (a) (1) and

- 1 (2) or remove diseases from the list under subsection (a) (2) for
- 2 which newborn children shall be screened and laboratory
- 3 screening results reported.
- 4 (ii) Move diseases established under subsection (a) (2) to
- 5 subsection (a) (1) for which newborn children shall be screened
- 6 and laboratory screening results reported.
- 7 (2) After January 1, 2017, the department may not move the
- 8 <u>diseases in the list under subsection (a)(1)(vii) to subsection</u>
- 9 <u>(a)(2).</u>

- 11 Section 2. Any regulation or publication of the Department
- 12 of Health in the Pennsylvania Bulletin is abrogated to the
- 13 extent of any inconsistency with this act.
- 14 Section 3. This act shall apply retroactively to January 1,
- 15 2017.
- 16 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
