## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for higher education accountability and transparency.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
11	article to read:

14	AND TRANSPARENCY
15	Section 2001-H. Definitions.
16	The following words and phrases when used in this article
17	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
18	<pre>context clearly indicates otherwise:</pre>
19	"Department." The Department of Education of the

- 1 Commonwealth.
- 2 "Graduation rates." The percentages of full-time
- 3 undergraduate students enrolled for credit toward a degree,
- 4 diploma, certificate or other formal credential who are awarded
- 5 <u>a degree</u>, diploma or certificate within each of the following:
- 6 (1) 100% of the normal completion time for the student's
- 7 program.
- 8 (2) 125% of the normal completion time for the student's
- 9 program.
- 10 (3) 150% of the normal completion time for the student's
- 11 program.
- "Institution of higher education." The term includes any of
- 13 the following:
- 14 (1) A community college operating under Article XIX-A.
- 15 (2) A university within the State System of Higher
- 16 Education.
- 17 (3) The Pennsylvania State University, the University of
- Pittsburgh, Temple University, Lincoln University or any
- other institution designated as State-related by the
- 20 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 21 (4) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.
- 22 <u>(5) An institution of higher education which is operated</u>
- 23 not for profit, located in and incorporated or chartered by
- 24 <u>the Commonwealth and entitled to confer degrees as set forth</u>
- 25 in 24 Pa.C.S. § 6505 (relating to power to confer degrees)
- 26 <u>and is designated as a "college" or "university" as provided</u>
- 27 for by the standards and qualifications prescribed by the
- 28 <u>State Board of Education under 24 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 (relating to</u>
- 29 private colleges, universities and seminaries).
- 30 (6) A private school licensed under the act of December

- 1 15, 1986 (P.L.1585, No.174), known as the Private Licensed
- 2 Schools Act.
- 3 "Net tuition and fees." The average total cost of attendance
- 4 <u>minus the average amount of grant or scholarship aid awarded to</u>
- 5 <u>a first-time</u>, full-time undergraduate student enrolled for
- 6 <u>credit toward a degree, diploma, certificate or other formal</u>
- 7 credential from the Federal Government, the Commonwealth or the
- 8 <u>institution of higher education.</u>
- 9 <u>"PHEAA." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance</u>
- 10 Agency.
- 11 <u>"Retention rate." The percentage of first-year, full-time</u>
- 12 <u>undergraduate students enrolled for credit toward a degree,</u>
- 13 diploma, certificate or other formal credential who continue to
- 14 <u>be enrolled at an institution of higher education in the</u>
- 15 <u>following school year.</u>
- 16 <u>"Total debt." The average per-student cumulative principal</u>
- 17 borrowed from a loan program, including Federal and State loan
- 18 programs, institutional loans and private alternate loans made
- 19 by a bank or lender.
- 20 Section 2002-H. Comparison tool.
- 21 (a) Duty of department. -- The department shall make available
- 22 on the department's publicly accessible Internet website a
- 23 search tool that allows an individual to compare institutions of
- 24 higher education that meet certain criteria selected by the
- 25 <u>individual</u>, including the offering of a particular major or
- 26 program of study.
- 27 <u>(b) Requirements.--The comparison tool required under this</u>
- 28 section must:
- 29 <u>(1) Be accessible from the department's publicly</u>
- 30 accessible Internet website.

1	(2) Allow a user to identify and compare institutions of
2	higher education by the following:
3	(i) Programs of study available.
4	<u>(ii) Name.</u>
5	(iii) Physical address.
6	(iv) Total enrollment for the previous academic
7	<u>year.</u>
8	(v) Net tuition and fees per year based on the
9	previous academic year.
10	(vi) Percentages of students receiving:
11	(A) Pell grants.
12	(B) Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity
13	grants.
14	(C) Academic Competitiveness grants.
15	(D) National Science and Mathematics Access to
16	Retain Talent grants.
17	(E) Teacher Education Assistance for College and
18	Higher Education grants.
19	(vii) Average total debt borrowed for undergraduate
20	study.
21	(viii) Graduation and retention rates, including
22	information on average time, in years, to attainment of a
23	degree, diploma, certificate or other formal credential
24	<pre>for a full-time student.</pre>
25	(ix) Percentage of undergraduate students who have
26	defaulted on their Federal student loans within three
27	<pre>years of entering repayment.</pre>
28	(3) Be accessible to the public without requiring
29	registration or use of a user name, password or other user
30	identification.

- 1 (4) Include a link to the publicly accessible Internet
- 2 website of the Department of Labor and Industry and a link to
- 3 the publicly accessible Internet website of each of the
- 4 <u>institutions of higher education selected.</u>
- 5 (5) Include a direct link to the High Priority
- 6 Occupations publicly accessible Internet website of the
- 7 Department of Labor and Industry with a description of what
- 8 <u>high priority occupations are and how they are identified.</u>
- 9 (c) Chart.--The comparison tool required under this section
- 10 must generate a comparison chart in a grid format that:
- 11 (1) Lists the institutions of higher education that
- 12 <u>match a user's search criteria.</u>
- 13 (2) Provides information for each institution of higher
- education listed as outlined in subsection (b) (2).
- 15 (d) Duty of institutions. -- Each institution of higher
- 16 education shall provide the information listed in this section,
- 17 as available, to the department not later than January 1 of each
- 18 year. If the information required under this subsection is
- 19 available in an institution of higher education's Integrated
- 20 Postsecondary Education Data System report, the institution of
- 21 higher education may comply with the reporting requirements of
- 22 this subsection by sending an electronic copy of the Integrated
- 23 <u>Postsecondary Education Data System report to the department.</u>
- 24 The department shall update the comparison tool as soon as
- 25 practicable after receiving information from each institution of
- 26 <u>higher education</u>.
- 27 (e) The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency
- 28 shall include a link on its publicly accessible Internet website
- 29 to the comparison tool required under this section.
- 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
