- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, providing for impact of scores from assessments.

- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 121.1. Impact of Scores from Assessments.--(a)</u>
- 13 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, beginning in the
- 14 <u>2017-2018 school year, student scores from assessments shall be</u>
- 15 attributed to a school entity only for the purposes of complying
- 16 with the Every Student Succeeds Act (Public Law 114-95, 129
- 17 Stat. 1802). Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to
- 18 prohibit the use of student scores from assessments to calculate
- 19 <u>academic growth using statistically reliable measures.</u>
- 20 (b) As used in this section, the term "assessment" shall

- 1 mean the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment test, the
- 2 <u>Keystone Exam, an equivalent local assessment or another test</u>
- 3 <u>established or approved by the State Board of Education or the</u>
- 4 General Assembly to meet the requirements of section 2603-B(d)
- 5 (10)(i) or required under the Every Student Succeeds Act or its
- 6 <u>successor statute or another test required to achieve other</u>
- 7 <u>standards established by the Department of Education for the</u>
- 8 public school or school district under 22 Pa. Code § 403.3
- 9 <u>(relating to single accountability system).</u>
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
