AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for and reorganizing the 2 conduct of the executive and administrative work of the 3 Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the 4 5 administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal 6 7 Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain 8 administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining 9 the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and 10 administrative officers, and of the several administrative 11 12 departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain 13 other executive and administrative officers; providing for 14 the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of 15 16 all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain 17 departments, boards, and commissions; providing for the regulation of pari-mutuel thoroughbred horse racing and 18 harness horse racing activities, imposing certain taxes and providing for the disposition of funds from pari-mutuel 19 20 tickets; and prescribing the manner in which the number and 21 compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and 22 employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall 23 be determined," in Commonwealth budget procedures, providing 24 25 for compulsory budget hearings. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 2 Section 626. Compulsory Budget Hearings.--(a) If
- 3 comprehensive companion spending and revenue bills are not
- 4 <u>introduced in the General Assembly by June 19th of each fiscal</u>
- 5 year, the following individuals or their designees shall
- 6 participate in compulsory daily public hearings on the State
- 7 <u>budget in the State Capitol Complex in accordance with</u>
- 8 <u>subsection</u> (b) until the spending and revenue bills are both
- 9 introduced:
- 10 (1) The Governor.
- 11 (2) The Lieutenant Governor.
- 12 <u>(3) The State Treasurer.</u>
- 13 (4) The Secretary of Revenue of the Commonwealth.
- 14 <u>(5) The Auditor General.</u>
- 15 <u>(6) The Director of the Independent Fiscal Office.</u>
- 16 (7) The President pro tempore of the Senate.
- 17 (8) The Majority Leader of the Senate.
- 18 (9) The Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 19 (10) The Majority and Minority Chairmen of the
- 20 Appropriations Committee of the Senate.
- 21 (11) The Majority Whip of the Senate.
- 22 (12) The Minority Whip of the Senate.
- 23 (13) The Majority and Minority caucus chairmen of the
- 24 Senate.
- 25 (14) The Majority and Minority Policy Committee chairmen of
- 26 the Senate.
- 27 (15) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 28 (16) The Majority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 29 (17) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.

- 8 (b) At least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the start of
- 9 the hearing required under subsection (a), a memorandum shall be
- 10 posted on the General Assembly's publicly accessible Internet
- 11 website addressing the budget status and concerns and
- 12 <u>suggestions regarding the budget from each executive branch</u>
- 13 <u>attendee and from each of the four legislative caucuses. Each</u>
- 14 hearing required under subsection (a) shall be at least two (2)
- 15 hours long and shall be broadcast on the General Assembly's
- 16 publicly accessible Internet website.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
