## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in school district financial
- 6 recovery, providing for exemption from prevailing wage laws.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 695-A. Exemption from prevailing wage laws.
- 13 (a) General rule. -- The provisions of the act of August 15,
- 14 1961 (P.L.987, No.442), known as the Pennsylvania Prevailing
- 15 Wage Act, shall not apply to a contract or proposed contract for
- 16 <u>a "public work," as defined in that act, by a school district,</u>
- 17 <u>if the school district commits or otherwise obligates the</u>
- 18 savings from the contract to the payment of the school
- 19 <u>district's employer contribution under 24 Pa.C.S. Pt. IV</u>

- 1 <u>(relating to retirement for school employees).</u>
- 2 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 3 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 4 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 5 <u>"Savings from the contract." The amount to be paid in the</u>
- 6 aggregate under a contract as if the prevailing wage rate were
- 7 required less the amount to be paid in the aggregate under the
- 8 contract without application of the prevailing wage rate.
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
