## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance,
- 4 providing for financial disclosures for pharmacy services.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 8 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 9 read:
- 10 <u>Section 449.1. Financial Disclosures for Pharmacy</u>
- 11 Services. -- (a) Any pharmacy benefits manager that contracts
- 12 with a medical assistance managed care organization under
- 13 contract with the department shall be prohibited from utilizing
- 14 any confidentiality provisions which would in effect prohibit
- 15 <u>disclosure of information to the medical assistance managed care</u>

- 1 organization and the department upon its request.
- 2 (b) Requests by the department may include the payment
- 3 methodology for the pharmacy benefits manager which must include
- 4 the actual amount paid by the pharmacy benefits manager to a
- 5 pharmacy for dispensing an outpatient covered drug or medical
- 6 supply item, including, at a minimum, the ingredient cost and
- 7 <u>dispensing fee and any other administrative fees.</u>
- 8 (c) A medical assistance managed care organization that
- 9 <u>assigns financial responsibility for determining the dispensing</u>
- 10 pharmacy payment methodology, including the ingredient cost and
- 11 <u>dispensing fee</u>, shall upon request disclose to the department
- 12 <u>all financial terms and payment arrangements that apply between</u>
- 13 the medical assistance managed care organization and the
- 14 pharmacy benefits manager annually and within ten days of any
- 15 changes to the financial terms and payment arrangements. For the
- 16 purposes of this act, a pharmacy benefits manager which
- 17 contracts with a medical assistance managed care organization
- 18 shall maintain records sufficient to provide information for
- 19 pharmaceuticals dispensed and paid for by medical assistance to
- 20 the department, including the information required under Chapter
- 21 7 of the act of November 21, 2016 (P.L.1318, No.169), known as
- 22 the Pharmacy "PHARMACY Audit Integrity and Transparency Act. <--
- 23 ACT." <--
- 24 (d) The department shall promulgate regulations necessary to <--
- 25 A MEDICAL ASSISTANCE MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATION SHALL establish <--
- 26 an appeals process for pharmacies to utilize for suspected
- 27 violations of this section.
- 28 (E) ANY INFORMATION DISCLOSED OR PRODUCED BY A PHARMACY <--
- 29 BENEFITS MANAGER OR A MEDICAL ASSISTANCE MANAGED CARE
- 30 ORGANIZATION TO THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE

- 1 SUBJECT TO THE ACT OF FEBRUARY 14, 2008 (P.L.6, NO.3), KNOWN AS
- 2 THE RIGHT-TO-KNOW LAW.
- 3 (e) (F) As used in this section, the following words and <--
- 4 phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection
- 5 <u>unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 6 "Pharmacy benefits management." Any MANAGEMENT" MEANS ANY of <--

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- 7 the following:
- 8 (1) Procurement of prescription drugs at a negotiated
- 9 contracted rate for distribution within this Commonwealth to
- 10 covered individuals.
- 11 (2) Administration or management of prescription drug
- 12 benefits provided by a covered entity for the benefit of covered
- 13 <u>individuals.</u>
- 14 (3) Administration of pharmacy benefits, including:
- (i) Operating a mail-service pharmacy.
- 16 (ii) Claims processing.
- 17 <u>(iii) Managing a retail pharmacy network management.</u>
- 18 (iv) Paying claims to pharmacies for prescription drugs
- 19 dispensed to covered individuals via retail or mail-order
- 20 pharmacy.
- 21 (v) Developing and managing a clinical formulary,
- 22 utilization management and quality assurance programs.
- 23 <u>(vi) Rebate contracting and administration.</u>
- 24 (vii) Managing a patient compliance, therapeutic
- 25 intervention and generic substitution program.
- 26 (viii) Operating a disease management program.
- 27 (ix) Setting pharmacy reimbursement pricing and
- 28 methodologies, including maximum allowable cost, and determining
- 29 single or multiple source drugs.
- 30 "Pharmacy benefits manager." A MANAGER MEANS A person,

- 1 <u>business</u> or other entity that performs pharmacy benefits
- 2 management. THE TERM SHALL INCLUDE A WHOLLY OWNED SUBSIDIARY OF <--
- 3 <u>A MEDICAL ASSISTANCE MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATION THAT PERFORMS</u>
- 4 PHARMACY BENEFITS MANAGEMENT.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
