AN ACT

1 Designating a portion of Pennsylvania Route 339 in Columbia  
2 County as the Turner Memorial Highway.

3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
4 hereby enacts as follows:

5 Section 1. Turner Memorial Highway.

6 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as  
7 follows:

8 (1) The Turner family of Nescopeck has made great  
9 sacrifices on behalf of the United States with family members  
10 having served in the armed services throughout World War II  
11 and the conflicts in Korea and Vietnam.

12 (2) During World War II, five members of the Turner  
13 family served simultaneously overseas, including brothers,  
14 Day, Ernest and Robert Turner, and brothers-in-law, Richard  
15 Stout and John Slusser.

16 (3) Sergeant Day G. Turner was killed in action during  
17 World War II on February 8, 1945, in Germany.

1           (4) Sergeant Ernest Turner was killed in action during  
2 the Korean Conflict after being injured in battle three times  
3 during World War II.

4           (5) Robert Turner, Richard Stout and John Slusser were  
5 wounded in battle during World War II.

6           (6) Grandson, Richard Stout, was wounded in action in  
7 Vietnam.

8       (b) Designation.--The section of Pennsylvania Route 339 in  
9 Columbia County from the Columbia/Luzerne County line to John  
10 Street in Mifflinville is designated the Turner Memorial  
11 Highway.

12       (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and  
13 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to  
14 traffic in both directions on the highway.

15 Section 2. Effective date.

16 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
