A RESOLUTION

- 1 Condemning acts of hate and vandalism against the Jewish
- 2 community.
- 3 WHEREAS, Individuals who show cultural insensitivity and an
- 4 animus to a particular group of people are harming all
- 5 Pennsylvanians; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Recently, there has been an alarming increase in the
- 7 number of acts of hate directed toward members of the Jewish
- 8 faith and this increase cannot be ignored; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Recent acts of hate number 154, including bomb
- 10 threats and acts of vandalism against museums, houses of
- 11 worship, advocacy groups and cemeteries; and
- 12 WHEREAS, This disturbing trend has occurred in this

- 1 Commonwealth and across the nation; and
- 2 WHEREAS, In late February of this year, vandals toppled more
- 3 than 100 gravestones at Mount Carmel Cemetery in Philadelphia, a
- 4 historic cemetery that dates back to the mid-1800s; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Families and loved ones have had to endure the
- 6 emotional trauma of seeing the desecrated headstones and come to
- 7 terms with the challenges brought about by the vandalism; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The perpetrators of the vandalism have not been
- 9 apprehended, and the families affected continue to suffer from
- 10 these acts of cowardice and hate; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In early March 2017, multiple Jewish community
- 12 centers across the country, including one in York and one in
- 13 Harrisburg, were evacuated after receiving threats; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Staff at the York Jewish Community Center (JCC)
- 15 received a call from a man who claimed there was a bomb in the
- 16 building; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The JCC staff evacuated the building and allowed the
- 18 authorities to sweep the building with bomb-sniffing dogs; and
- 19 WHEREAS, As children in the JCC's day care were being
- 20 evacuated their parents were contacted and reacted with panic;
- 21 and
- 22 WHEREAS, The families who endured threats continue to remain
- 23 on guard, fearful about whether a similar act will follow; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The community in York, the York authorities, the
- 25 Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation
- 26 continue to investigate these acts and remain determined to
- 27 bring those responsible to justice; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Throughout the country, police have reported threats
- 29 to Jewish institutions; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Over the recent Purim holiday, the Louis S. Wolk

- 1 Jewish Community Center in Rochester, New York, was evacuated
- 2 Sunday morning for the second time in less than a week during
- 3 its hosting of a "warming center" for people whose homes had
- 4 lost power; and
- 5 WHEREAS, These acts represent a continuing and disturbing
- 6 pattern of intimidation and hate; and
- 7 WHEREAS, We all stand united against such cowardly acts; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Our Commonwealth cannot be defined by these acts,
- 9 but rather should be defined by our residents' response to these
- 10 acts; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives condemn acts of
- 12 hate and vandalism that have been committed against the Jewish
- 13 community; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
- 15 Pennsylvanians to remain steadfast in rejecting cultural
- 16 insensitivity and use this as a moment when we can come together
- 17 to educate young people and adults on understanding and
- 18 appreciating all members of our community and residents of this
- 19 Commonwealth.
