A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating July 13, 2017, as "Summer Learning Day" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, "Summer Learning Day" is a day to reflect on the
4	importance of keeping youths learning, safe and healthy every
5	summer and ensuring that they return to school in the fall ready
6	to succeed in the year ahead; and
7	WHEREAS, Summer learning loss is a significant contributor to
8	the achievement gap, a gap which remains constant during the
9	nine months of the school year but widens during the summer
10	months; and
11	WHEREAS, Summer learning programs are proven to maintain and
12	advance students' academic and social growth, keep children safe
13	and healthy during the summer and send young individuals back to
14	school ready to learn; and
15	WHEREAS, Summer youth employment programs engage older youths
16	in meaningful activities that allow them to explore careers of

1 interest, take on new responsibilities, contribute to their
2 community and earn money for the future; and

WHEREAS, A wide array of public agencies, community-based 3 organizations, schools, libraries, museums, recreation centers, 4 camps and businesses in our community contribute to the well-5 being of youths through summer programming; and 6 WHEREAS, Summer learning is a critical component of our 7 8 collective effort to ensure that all students graduate from high 9 school prepared for college, careers and life; therefore be it 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate July 13, 2017, as "Summer Learning Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it 11 12 further 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the

14 importance of providing a safe learning environment for children 15 after school and during the summer months and support these 16 programs.

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
