A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing October 2, 2017, as "Blue Shirt Day® World Day of Bullying Prevention" in Pennsylvania in support of those
- working hard to raise awareness of bullying and preventing
- 4 its occurrence.
- 5 WHEREAS, Bullying is physical, verbal, sexual or emotional
- 6 harm or intimidation intentionally directed at an individual or
- 7 group of individuals; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Bullying occurs in neighborhoods, playgrounds,
- 9 schools and through technology such as the Internet and cell
- 10 phones; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Thousands of Pennsylvania children and adolescents
- 12 are affected by bullying annually; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Targets of bullying are more likely to acquire
- 14 physical, emotional and learning problems; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Students who are repeatedly bullied often fear
- 16 activities including riding the bus, going to school and

- 1 attending community activities; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Children who bully are at greater risk of engaging
- 3 in more serious violent behaviors; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Children who witness bullying often feel less
- 5 secure, more fearful and intimidated; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Bullying directly affects a student's ability to
- 7 learn, and bullied students may find it difficult to concentrate
- 8 in school, show a decline in grades and lose self-esteem, self-
- 9 confidence and self-worth; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Students can be especially effective in bullying
- 11 intervention; and
- 12 WHEREAS, According to the National Bullying Prevention
- 13 Center, more than 55% of bullying situations will stop when a
- 14 peer intervenes; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Student education on how to address bullying for
- 16 peers is critical, as is the support of adults; and
- 17 WHEREAS, October is "National Bullying Prevention Awareness
- 18 Month," a time when anti-bullying activities take place in
- 19 schools and communities; and
- 20 WHEREAS, To signify the importance of "National Bullying
- 21 Prevention Awareness Month," STOMP Out Bullying™, the leading
- 22 national anti-bullying and cyberbullying organization for kids
- 23 and teens, created "Blue Shirt Day® World Day of Bullying
- 24 Prevention™; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Founded in 2005, STOMP Out Bullying™ focuses on
- 26 reducing and preventing bullying, cyberbullying, sexting and
- 27 other digital abuse, educating against racism and hatred and
- 28 deterring violence in schools, online and in communities across
- 29 the country; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Since 2008, "Blue Shirt Day® World Day of Bullying

- 1 Prevention $^{\text{TM}}$ has been recognized on the first Monday of October,
- 2 which is October 2 this year; and
- 3 WHEREAS, STOMP Out Bullying™ asks students, schools, parents
- 4 and businesses to GO BLUE on October 2, 2017, by wearing a blue
- 5 shirt; and
- 6 WHEREAS, A collective effort within our communities and
- 7 schools is vital to raising awareness of bullying and bullying
- 8 prevention; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize October
- 10 2, 2017, as "Blue Shirt Day® World Day of Bullying Prevention™"
- 11 in Pennsylvania in support of those working hard to raise
- 12 awareness of bullying and prevent its occurrence.
