A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Joint State Government Commission to study the 1 long-term workforce and workforce training needs of the Commonwealth's health care sector. 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is the sixth most populous state in the 4 5 United States with diverse demographics and ever-changing health care needs; and 6 7 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth's growing aging population, steady increase in chronic disease and the ever-present threat of 8 emerging health crises, such as the current opioid epidemic, 9 10 make patient access to high-quality health care, regardless of 11 location, more important than ever before; and 12 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth's ability to maintain a world-13 class health care system is dependent on the availability of a 14 well-skilled, well-trained workforce and the ability of its
- 15 providers to attract and retain that workforce; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Health care and social assistance is the largest
- 17 employment sector in this Commonwealth; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The strength of this Commonwealth's health care
- 19 sector significantly impacts not only the health and well-being

- 1 of patients, but also the long-term economic prosperity and
- 2 stability of communities; therefore be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 4 State Government Commission to study what the long-term health
- 5 care workforce and workforce training needs of this Commonwealth
- 6 will be over the next five years; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission study
- 8 how current Federal and State statutes and regulations impact
- 9 the ability of this Commonwealth's health care system to meet
- 10 those needs identified by the commission; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the study include recommendations to ensure
- 12 that this Commonwealth is able to adequately train, attract and
- 13 retain the workforce needed to meet those needs identified by
- 14 the Joint State Government Commission; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That, for its report, the Joint State Government
- 16 Commission shall solicit input from representatives of all
- 17 aspects of the health care sector and continuum of care; and be
- 18 it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission issue
- 20 the report with its findings and any recommendations to the
- 21 House of Representatives no later than one year after the
- 22 adoption of this resolution.
