AN ACT

Amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in anatomical gifts, 2 further providing for manner of executing anatomical gifts. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 8613 of Title 20 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read: 8 § 8613. Manner of executing anatomical gifts. 9 * * * (g) Rights and protections for certain individuals .--10 11 (1) (i) An individual who is a candidate to receive IN <--12 NEED OF an anatomical gift shall not be deemed ineligible 13 to receive an anatomical gift solely because of the 14 individual's physical or mental disability, except to the 15 extent that the physical or mental disability has been

found by a physician or surgeon following an

1	individualized evaluation of the potential recipient	<
2	INDIVIDUAL to be medically significant to the provision	<
3	of the anatomical gift.	
4	(ii) If an individual has the necessary support	
5	system to assist the individual in complying with	
6	posttransplant medical requirements, an individual's	
7	inability to independently comply with those requirements	_
8	shall not be deemed to be medically significant.	
9	(iii) The provisions of this subsection shall apply	<
10	to each part of the organ transplant process.	
11	(2) The court shall accord priority on its calendar and	
12	expeditiously proceed with an action brought to seek any	
13	remedy authorized by law for purposes of enforcing compliance	=
14	with the provisions of this section.	
15	(3) The provisions of this section shall not be deemed	
16	to require referrals or recommendations for, or the	
17	performance of, medically inappropriate organ transplants.	
18	(4) (2) As used in this subsection, the term	<
19	"disability" shall have the same meaning as in the Americans	
20	with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat.	
21	<u>327).</u>	
22	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
