Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in enforcement, further providing for jurisdiction 2 and penalties; and, in game or wildlife protection, further 3 providing for unlawful taking and possession of protected birds and for endangered or threatened species. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Sections 925(b), 2164(d) and 2167(d) of Title 34 8 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended by adding 10 paragraphs to read: § 925. Jurisdiction and penalties. 11 12 13 (b) Fines and penalties for violations. -- In addition to any 14 other requirements of this title, the following fines and 15 penalties shall be imposed for violations of this title: * * * 16 17 (4.1) Summary offense and not less than \$2,500 when the offense involves a violation of section 2164 (relating to 18
