AN ACT

Threat against law enforcement officer or sheriff. 8 9 (a) Offense defined. -- A person who threatens the following 10 with death or serious bodily injury commits an offense under this section: 11 12 (1) A law enforcement officer. 13 (2) A sheriff or deputy sheriff. 14 (3) A family or household member of an individual under 15 paragraph (1) or (2). (b) Grading. --16 (1) A first offense under this section constitutes a 17

- 1 (2) A second or subsequent offense under this section
- 2 <u>constitutes a felony of the second degree.</u>
- 3 (c) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 4 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 5 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 6 <u>"Family or household member." Spouses or persons who have</u>
- 7 been spouses, persons living as spouses or who lived as spouses,
- 8 parents and children, other persons related by consanguinity or
- 9 <u>affinity</u>, <u>current or former sexual or intimate partners or</u>
- 10 persons who share biological parenthood.
- 11 "Law enforcement officer." As the term "peace officer" is
- 12 <u>defined under section 501 (relating to definitions).</u>
- 13 "Serious bodily injury." Impairment of physical condition or
- 14 <u>substantial pain that creates a substantial risk of death or</u>
- 15 that causes serious permanent disfigurement or protracted loss
- 16 or impairment of function of any bodily member or organ.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
