AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, further
- 6 providing for Keystone Exams.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 121(a) of the act of March 10, 1949
- 10 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
- 11 amended February 3, 2016 (P.L.1, No.1), is amended and the
- 12 section is amended by adding subsections to read:
- 13 Section 121. Keystone Exams. -- (a) [Subject to annual
- 14 appropriation, not later than the 2020-2021 school year, the]
- 15 The Department of Education shall develop and implement Keystone
- 16 Exams in [the following subjects:] algebra I, literature[,
- 17 biology, English composition, algebra II, geometry, United
- 18 States history, chemistry, civics and government and world
- 19 history.] and biology. The State Board of Education shall
- 20 promulgate regulations, subject to the act of June 25, 1982

- 1 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the "Regulatory Review Act,"
- 2 necessary to implement this section.
- 3 * * *
- 4 (c) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 5 4.24 or 4.51 or any statute or regulation to the contrary, in
- 6 any school year in which a demonstration of proficiency on a
- 7 <u>Keystone Exam is required for high school graduation, a CTE</u>
- 8 Concentrator shall be deemed proficient provided that the CTE
- 9 <u>Concentrator shall meet all of the following requirements:</u>
- 10 (1) completes locally established grade-based requirements
- 11 for academic content areas associated with each Keystone Exam on
- 12 which the CTE Concentrator did not achieve proficiency. For the
- 13 purposes of this paragraph, completion of grade-based
- 14 requirements in any science and technology and environment and
- 15 <u>ecology course shall satisfy the requirements for the academic</u>
- 16 content area associated with the Keystone Exam in biology; and
- 17 (2) completes one of the following:
- (i) attains an industry-based competency certification
- 19 related to the CTE Concentrator's program of study; or
- 20 (ii) demonstrates a high likelihood of success on an
- 21 approved industry-based competency assessment or readiness for
- 22 continued meaningful engagement in the CTE Concentrator's
- 23 program of study as demonstrated by performance on benchmark
- 24 assessments, course grades and other factors consistent with the
- 25 CTE Concentrator's goals and career plan.
- 26 (d) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 27 <u>4.24 or 4.51 or any statute or regulation to the contrary, in</u>
- 28 any school year in which a demonstration of proficiency on a
- 29 Keystone Exam is required for high school graduation, a student
- 30 shall be deemed proficient if the student demonstrates

- 1 competency in standards-based subject matter content through
- 2 course grades or assessments and through three or more rigorous
- 3 and compelling pieces of evidence that reflect the student's
- 4 <u>readiness for meaningful postsecondary engagement consistent</u>
- 5 with the student's goals and career plans. The rigorous and
- 6 compelling pieces of evidence include, but are not limited to,
- 7 the following:
- 8 (1) The earning of a passing grade in a dual enrollment
- 9 course.
- 10 (2) Adequate performance on the Armed Services Vocational
- 11 Aptitude Battery test for enlistment.
- 12 <u>(3) A guaranteed full-time employment letter.</u>
- 13 <u>(4) Attainment of a high-value industry credential.</u>
- 14 (5) Attainment of a workforce readiness certificate.
- 15 (6) A certificate of successful completion of an internship
- 16 program related to career goals.
- 17 (7) High performance on the Academic Standards for Career
- 18 Education and Work assessment.
- 19 (8) High performance on an SAT or ACT subject-specific test.
- (e) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 21 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 22 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 23 "Approved_industry-based_competency_assessment." A NOCTI_
- 24 exam, NIMS assessment or other industry-based competency
- 25 assessment identified by the Secretary of Education and approved
- 26 by the State Board of Education.
- 27 "CTE Concentrator." A student who, by the end of a reporting
- 28 year, will be reported as successfully completing at least fifty
- 29 percent (50%) of the minimum technical instructional hours
- 30 required under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 339 (relating to vocational

- 1 <u>education</u>).
- 2 "NIMS assessment." An assessment based on the National
- 3 <u>Institute for Metalworking Skills standards.</u>
- 4 "NOCTI exam." A National Occupational Competency Testing
- 5 Institute exam.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
