## AN ACT

- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for examination of applicant for driver's license; and, in rules 3 4 of the road in general, further providing for prohibiting text-based communications and providing for prohibiting use 7 of interactive wireless communications device by novice drivers. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- 11 Section 1. The definition of "interactive wireless
- communications device" in section 102 of Title 75 of the 12
- 13 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is
- 14 amended by adding a definition to read:
- 15 § 102. Definitions.
- 16 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
- 17 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
- 18 provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
- 19 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly
- 20 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:
- 2.1 \* \* \*

- 1 "Interactive wireless communications device." A wireless
- 2 telephone, personal digital assistant, smart phone, portable or
- 3 mobile computer or similar device which can be used for voice
- 4 communication, texting, e-mailing, browsing the Internet or
- 5 instant messaging or means through which personal wireless
- 6 <u>services are transmitted</u>. The term does not include any of the
- 7 following:
- 8 (1) a device being used exclusively as a global
- 9 positioning or navigation system;
- 10 (2) a system or device that is physically or
- electronically integrated into the vehicle; [or]
- 12 (3) a communications device that is affixed to a mass
- transit vehicle, bus or school bus[.]; or
- 14 (4) a device being used exclusively for emergency
- 15 notification purposes.

- 17 <u>"Novice driver." A driver under 18 years of age or a person</u>
- 18 with a learner's permit.

- 20 Section 2. Section 1508 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
- 21 subsection to read:
- 22 § 1508. Examination of applicant for driver's license.
- 23 \* \* \*
- 24 (c.1) Distracted driving awareness. -- The portion of the
- 25 <u>examination on traffic laws shall contain at least one question</u>
- 26 on distracted driving relating to the driver's ability to
- 27 <u>understand the effects of distracted driving. The driver's</u>
- 28 manual shall include a section relating to distracted driving,
- 29 the effects of distracted driving, the laws on distracted
- 30 driving and related penalties.

- 2 Section 3. Section 3316(a), (b) and (d) of Title 75 are
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 § 3316. Prohibiting text-based communications.
- 5 (a) Prohibition. -- No driver shall operate a motor vehicle on
- 6 a highway or trafficway in this Commonwealth while using an
- 7 interactive wireless communications device to send, read or
- 8 write a text-based communication [while the vehicle is in
- 9 motion. A], unless the motor vehicle is parked on the side or
- 10 <u>shoulder of a highway or trafficway in this Commonwealth where</u>
- 11 the motor vehicle is safely able to remain stationary. Except
- 12 for a novice driver, a person does not send, read or write a
- 13 text-based communication when the person reads, selects or
- 14 enters a telephone number or name in an interactive wireless
- 15 communications device for the purpose of activating or
- 16 deactivating a voice communication or a telephone call.
- 17 (b) [(Reserved).] Nonapplicability.--Subsection (a) shall
- 18 not apply to a driver who:
- 19 (1) uses an interactive wireless communications device
- 20 <u>to contact emergency services;</u>
- 21 (2) is emergency services personnel and uses an
- 22 interactive wireless communications device while:
- 23 (i) is operating an emergency services vehicle; and
- (ii) is engaged in the performance of the duties as
- 25 <u>an emergency service personnel; or</u>
- 26 (3) is employed as a commercial motor vehicle driver or
- a school bus driver who within the scope of the individual's
- 28 employment uses an interactive wireless communications device
- 29 if the use is permitted under regulations promulgated under
- 30 49 U.S.C. § 31136 (relating to United States Government

- 1 regulations).

- 3 (d) Penalty. -- A person who violates subsection (a) commits a
- 4 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay
- 5 a fine of [\$50.] \$100 for the first offense and \$200 for a
- 6 second or subsequent offense.

- 8 Section 4. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 3317. Prohibiting use of interactive wireless communications
- device by novice drivers.
- 11 (a) Prohibition. -- A novice driver may not operate a motor
- 12 vehicle on a highway or trafficway in this Commonwealth while
- 13 <u>using an interactive wireless communications device</u>, unless the
- 14 motor vehicle is parked on the side or shoulder of a highway or
- 15 trafficway in this Commonwealth where the motor vehicle is
- 16 safely able to remain stationary.
- 17 (b) Seizure. -- The provisions of this section shall not be
- 18 construed as authorizing the seizure or forfeiture of an
- 19 <u>interactive wireless communications device</u>, unless otherwise
- 20 provided by law.
- 21 (c) Nonapplicability. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to a
- 22 novice driver who:
- 23 <u>(1) uses an interactive wireless communications</u> device
- to contact emergency services;
- 25 (2) is emergency services personnel and uses an
- 26 interactive wireless communications device while:
- 27 (i) is operating an emergency services vehicle; and
- (ii) engaged in the performance of the duties as an
- 29 emergency service personnel; or
- 30 (3) is employed as a commercial motor vehicle driver or

- 1 <u>a school bus driver who within the scope of the individual's</u>
- 2 employment uses an interactive wireless communications device
- 3 if the use is permitted under regulations promulgated under
- 4 49 U.S.C. § 31136 (relating to United States government
- 5 regulations).
- 6 (d) Penalty. -- A novice driver who violates subsection (a)
- 7 commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be
- 8 sentenced to pay a fine of \$100 for the first offense and \$200
- 9 <u>for a second or subsequent offense.</u>
- 10 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
