- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance,
- 4 providing for medical assistance reimbursement for
- 5 pharmacies.
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 9 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 10 read:
- 11 <u>Section 450. Medical Assistance Reimbursement for</u>
- 12 Pharmacies. -- (a) For individuals receiving services under the
- 13 fee for service delivery system, the department shall reimburse
- 14 pharmacies as follows:
- 15 (1) If the NADAC per unit is available, the fee for service
- 16 payment shall be the lower of the following amounts:
- 17 (i) The NADAC per unit with the addition of a professional
- 18 dispensing fee of ten dollars and forty-nine cents (\$10.49) per
- 19 prescription.

- 1 (ii) The pharmacy's usual and customary charge for the drug
- 2 dispensed.
- 3 (2) If the NADAC per unit is unavailable, the fee for
- 4 <u>service payment shall be the lower of the following amounts:</u>
- 5 (i) The wholesale acquisition cost with the addition of a
- 6 professional dispensing fee of ten dollars and forty-nine cents
- 7 (\$10.49) per prescription.
- 8 (ii) The pharmacy's usual and customary charge for the drug
- 9 <u>dispensed.</u>
- 10 (b) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 11 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 12 <u>the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 13 "NADAC per unit." The current National Average Drug
- 14 Acquisition Cost per unit.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
