7	(a) Creation. There is created the Nutrient Management
8	Advisory Board. The board shall consist of 16 members appointed
9	by the chairman of the commission and approved by a two-thirds-
10	vote of the commission. The members so appointed shall consist
11	of five active commercial farm owners or operators representing-
12	the livestock, swine, meat poultry, egg poultry and dairy-
13	industry nominated by Statewide general farm organizations, one-
14	veterinary nutrition specialist, one representative from the
15	feed industry, one representative from the fertilizer industry,
16	one representative of commercial agricultural lenders, one
17	representative of local government, one representative of
18	academia who shall be an agronomist or plant scientist faculty
19	member of the school of agriculture of a Pennsylvania college or
20	university, one representative of academia who shall be an-
21	animal science faculty member with an expertise in odor
22	management from the school of agriculture of a college or
23	university within this Commonwealth, one hydrologist, two-
24	citizen representatives who are not farmers and one
25	environmental representative, all of whom shall have sufficient
26	knowledge, experience or familiarity with agronomic practices,
27	nutrient management practices or odor management practices and
28	all of whom shall be residents of this Commonwealth.
29	(b) Compensation. Board members shall not receive a salary
30	but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary

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1	expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
2	(c) Meetings. A majority of the board shall constitute a
3	quorum. All actions of the board shall be by a majority vote.
4	The board shall meet upon the call of the commission, but not
5	less than semiannually, to carry out its duties under this-
6	chapter. The board shall annually select a chairman and such-
7	other officers as it deems appropriate.
8	(d) Duties The board shall review and comment on all-
9	commission proposed regulations, the interim guidelines under-
10	section 504(2) (relating to powers and duties of commission) and
11	the interim criteria under section 504(5) developed to implement
12	the provisions of this chapter. The commission shall have no-
13	power to promulgate regulations, interim guidelines or interim-
14	criteria under this chapter until receipt of written comments on-
15	the proposed regulations, guidelines or criteria from the board
16	or until 60 days have expired from the date when the
17	regulations, guidelines or criteria were submitted by the-
18	commission to the board for its comments. Existing regulations,
19	guidelines and criteria shall continue until modified,
20	superseded or repealed by the commission.
21	(e) TermThe term of office for each board member shall be-
22	three years except that the commission shall stagger the initial
23	terms of the charter members such that five shall serve for one-
24	year, five shall serve for two years and six shall serve for-
25	three years. Board members may be appointed to successive terms

27	serve more than two three year terms.}

18	<u>§ 802. Establishment of Farm Animal Advisory Board.</u>
19	(a) EstablishmentThe Farm Animal Advisory Board is
20	established within the department.
21	(b) Members. The board shall be comprised of the following
22	members:
23	(1) Four individuals who own or operate an animal
24	operation, selected from nominations submitted by the
25	<u>Pennsylvania Farm Bureau, Pennsylvania State Grange, PennAg</u>
26	Industries Association and Pennsylvania Farmers Union. Each
27	organization under this paragraph shall submit a list of
28	nominations to the secretary, who shall appoint one member
29	from each organization's list.
30	(2) Five general CAFO permittees or CAO operators from

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1	mature dairy cow, veal calf, cattle other than mature dairy
2	cows or veal calves, swine, horse, sheep or lamb, turkey,
3	laying hen or broiler, chicken other than laying hens, and
4	duck operations. All individuals appointed under this
5	paragraph shall be from distinct operations.
6	(3) Two individual CAFO permittees from distinct
7	operations listed under paragraph (2).
8	(4) Four individuals, who shall serve as ex officio,
9	nonvoting members:
10	(i) Two members of the faculty of The Pennsylvania
11	State University, one with expertise in agronomy and
12	plant science and one with expertise in animal science
13	and odor management, appointed annually by The
14	<u>Pennsylvania State University.</u>
15	(ii) One deputy secretary from the Department of
16	Agriculture and one deputy secretary from the department.
17	If a named deputy secretary is unable to serve on the
18	board, the deputy secretary shall be replaced by another
19	deputy secretary or by the secretary of the department
20	represented.
21	(c) Appointment and term The secretary, in consultation
22	with the Secretary of Agriculture, shall appoint the members to
23	serve under subsections (b)(1), (2) and (3). Appointments shall
24	be made in a manner that provides representation of the
25	northwest, north central, northeast, southwest, south central
26	and southeast regions of this Commonwealth, corresponding to the
27	regions served by the department's regional offices. The terms
28	of each member shall be three years, but the secretary shall
29	stagger the initial terms of charter members under this
30	subsection such that three shall serve for one year, three shall

1	serve for two years and five shall serve for three years. Board
2	members may be appointed to successive terms.
3	(d) CompensationBoard members shall not receive a salary
4	but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary
5	expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
6	(e) Meetings. A majority of the board shall constitute a
7	quorum. All actions of the board shall be by a majority vote of
8	the voting members. The board shall meet upon call of the
9	secretary, but not less than semiannually, to carry out the
10	board's duties under this chapter.
11	(f) Chairperson The board shall annually elect a board
12	chairperson from among the voting members.
13	(g) Staff. The department shall furnish the board with
14	administrative support, including the development of board
15	bylaws consistent with this chapter and providing meeting space.

18	(1) To provide advice and expertise to the secretary and
19	the commission chair concerning animal operations.
20	(2) To provide advice and expertise to the commission

24	the development of regulatory standards and provide written
25	comments on new and existing interpretive, administrative and

30	permits.
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1	(4) To assist the secretary and the commission by
2	providing comments on regulatory proposals under section 804
3	(relating to review of regulations).
4	<u>§ 804. Review of regulations.</u>
5	(a) Notice to board The department and commission shall
6	notify the board of the development of a regulatory proposal
7	that may affect animal operations as early as possible but not
8	less than 150 days prior to the date the proposal is formally
9	initiated by an agency.
10	(b) Meeting and consultation with board. At the request of
11	the board, if the request is made within 30 days from the date
12	of receipt of the notice required by subsection (a), the
13	proposing agency shall meet and consult with the board in the
14	formulation of the regulatory proposal, and then the board may
15	provide the proposing agency with written comments.
16	(c) Inclusion of comments with proposed rulemaking The
17	proposing agency shall include any written comments of the board
18	received prior to the initiation of proposed rulemaking or
19	formal action taken on the regulatory proposal. For a regulatory
20	proposal for which proposed rulemaking is not required, the
21	proposing agency shall prepare and submit to the board a
22	document that responds to comments offered by the board,
23	including reasons why recommendations offered by the board in
24	its comments were not adopted.
25	(d) Exceptions. The requirements of this section shall not
26	apply to regulations with mandatory statutory deadlines, court
27	ordered regulations, emergency regulations, final regulations
28	adopted under section 204 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.769,
29	No.240), referred to as the Commonwealth Documents Law, or
30	interim regulations otherwise authorized by statute. As soon as
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1 possible, the department shall advise the board as to the

2 development of regulations under this subsection that would

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3 <u>regulate animal operations.</u>

THE MEMBERS SO APPOINTED SHALL CONSIST 11 OF [FIVE] SIX ACTIVE COMMERCIAL FARM OWNERS OR OPERATORS 12 13 REPRESENTING THE LIVESTOCK, SWINE, MEAT POULTRY, EGG POULTRY AND DAIRY INDUSTRY NOMINATED BY STATEWIDE GENERAL FARM 14 ORGANIZATIONS, ONE VETERINARY NUTRITION SPECIALIST, ONE 15 REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE FEED INDUSTRY, ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM 16 THE FERTILIZER INDUSTRY, [ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF COMMERCIAL 17 18 AGRICULTURAL LENDERS,] ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT, 19 ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF ACADEMIA WHO SHALL BE AN AGRONOMIST OR PLANT SCIENTIST FACULTY MEMBER OF THE SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE OF A 20 PENNSYLVANIA COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY, ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF 21 ACADEMIA WHO SHALL BE AN ANIMAL SCIENCE FACULTY MEMBER WITH AN 22 23 EXPERTISE IN ODOR MANAGEMENT FROM THE SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE OF A 24 COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY WITHIN THIS COMMONWEALTH, ONE HYDROLOGIST, 25 TWO CITIZEN REPRESENTATIVES WHO ARE NOT FARMERS AND ONE ENVIRONMENTAL REPRESENTATIVE, ALL OF WHOM SHALL HAVE SUFFICIENT 26 27 KNOWLEDGE, EXPERIENCE OR FAMILIARITY WITH AGRONOMIC PRACTICES, 28 NUTRIENT MANAGEMENT PRACTICES OR ODOR MANAGEMENT PRACTICES AND 29 ALL OF WHOM SHALL BE RESIDENTS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH. 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A MANNER THAT PROVIDES REPRESENTATION OF THE NORTHWEST, NORTH 1 2 CENTRAL, NORTHEAST, SOUTHWEST, SOUTH CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST REGIONS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH, CORRESPONDING TO THE REGIONS 3 SERVED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION REGIONAL 4 OFFICES. TWO OF THE SIX ACTIVE COMMERCIAL FARM OWNERS OR 5 OPERATORS SHALL HOLD AN ACTIVE CONCENTRATED ANIMAL FEEDING 6 7 OPERATION PERMIT AS REQUIRED BY THE ACT OF JUNE 22, 1937 8 (P.L.1987, NO.394), KNOWN AS THE CLEAN STREAMS LAW. 9 * * *

10 (D) DUTIES.--THE BOARD SHALL REVIEW AND COMMENT ON ALL 11 COMMISSION PROPOSED REGULATIONS, THE INTERIM GUIDELINES UNDER 12 SECTION 504(2) (RELATING TO POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION) AND 13 THE INTERIM CRITERIA UNDER SECTION 504(5) DEVELOPED TO IMPLEMENT 14 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER. THE COMMISSION SHALL HAVE NO POWER TO PROMULGATE REGULATIONS, INTERIM GUIDELINES OR INTERIM 15 16 CRITERIA UNDER THIS CHAPTER UNTIL RECEIPT OF WRITTEN COMMENTS ON THE PROPOSED REGULATIONS, GUIDELINES OR CRITERIA FROM THE BOARD 17 18 OR UNTIL [60] <u>90</u> DAYS HAVE EXPIRED FROM THE DATE WHEN THE 19 REGULATIONS, GUIDELINES OR CRITERIA WERE SUBMITTED BY THE 20 COMMISSION TO THE BOARD FOR ITS COMMENTS. EXISTING REGULATIONS, 21 GUIDELINES AND CRITERIA SHALL CONTINUE UNTIL MODIFIED, 22 SUPERSEDED OR REPEALED BY THE COMMISSION.

6 SECTION 3. MEMBERS OF THE NUTRIENT MANAGEMENT ADVISORY
7 BOARD, AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, SHALL CONTINUE
8 TO SERVE AS MEMBERS UNTIL THEIR PRESENT TERMS OF OFFICE EXPIRE.
