A RESOLUTION

1 2	Condemning the practice of selectively aborting fetuses with Down syndrome.
3	WHEREAS, Recent reports have characterized Iceland's near
4	eradication of Down syndrome as laudable despite the eradication
5	being the result of abortion following prenatal diagnosis of
6	Down syndrome; and
7	WHEREAS, Purposefully encouraging abortion and using other
8	sterilization techniques to rid society of a class of
9	individuals are heinous, immoral actions, essentially practicing
10	eugenics; and
11	WHEREAS, Eugenics is a science that deals with the
12	improvement of hereditary qualities of a race or breed by
13	controlling human mating and reproduction; and
14	WHEREAS, Historically, the vile tactics of eugenics have been
15	practiced worldwide and widely condemned after their expanded
16	use in Nazi Germany; and
17	WHEREAS, The notion that an individual with Down syndrome is

1 incapable of leading a full life is grossly flawed; and 2 WHEREAS, After receiving prenatal test results, parents should not be pressured into aborting their children; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Resources should be devoted to improving the lives of those with Down syndrome, developing and delivering new and 5 effective educational, behavioral and drug treatments for Down 6 syndrome and conducting related research; therefore be it 7 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate condemn the practice of selectively 9 aborting fetuses with Down syndrome; and be it further 10 RESOLVED, That individuals with Down syndrome be respected and admired for the joy and contributions they bring to society. 11
