## A RESOLUTION

Designating the month of September 2017 as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania, encouraging young Pennsylvanians who are fighting cancer, honoring young people 3 who have lost their lives to childhood cancer, expressing gratitude to the doctors and nurses who provide special care 5 to patients and families affected by childhood cancer and 6 encouraging all residents in this Commonwealth to join the 7 fight against childhood cancer. WHEREAS, Childhood cancers make up less than 1% of all 10 cancers diagnosed each year and childhood cancer rates have been 11 rising slightly for the past few decades; and 12 WHEREAS, Childhood cancer is the second leading cause of 13 death in children under 15 years of age, exceeded only by accidents, and approximately 1,190 children are expected to die 15 from cancer in 2017; and 16 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that 17 approximately 10,270 children in the United States under 15 18 years of age will be diagnosed with cancer in 2017; and 19 WHEREAS, The potential years of life lost to childhood cancer

- 1 and the potential years of life saved by treatment exceed all
- 2 other cancers with the exception of breast cancer; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Most children cannot be treated at a local hospital,
- 4 and families must face the disruption of relocating to receive
- 5 treatment at a regional cancer center; and
- 6 WHEREAS, As a result of major treatment advances in recent
- 7 decades, more than 80% of children with cancer now survive five
- 8 years or more; and
- 9 WHEREAS, This is a huge increase since the mid-1970s, when
- 10 the five-year survival rate was less than 60%; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Survival rates vary depending on the type of cancer
- 12 and other factors; and
- 13 WHEREAS, There is still significant progress that must be
- 14 made with regard to childhood cancer treatment because there are
- 15 many types of childhood cancer and some types with lower
- 16 survival rates are very difficult to treat; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is a leader in the fight against and
- 18 treatment of childhood cancer with six Children's Oncology Group
- 19 hospitals, St. Christopher's Hospital for Children, Children's
- 20 Hospital of Philadelphia, Geisinger Medical Center, Lehigh
- 21 Valley Hospital-Muhlenburg, Hershey Medical Center and
- 22 Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Two of only 10 institutions in the Pediatric Brain
- 24 Tumor Consortium are in Pennsylvania: Children's Hospital of
- 25 Philadelphia and Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital is one of
- 27 only 11 institutions nationwide in the Pediatric Oncology
- 28 Experimental Therapeutic Investigators' Consortium; therefore be
- 29 it
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of September

- 1 2017 as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and
- 2 be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage young Pennsylvanians who
- 4 are fighting cancer, honor young people who have lost their
- 5 lives to childhood cancer, express gratitude to the doctors and
- 6 nurses who provide special care to patients and families
- 7 affected by childhood cancer and encourage all residents in this
- 8 Commonwealth to join the fight against childhood cancer.
