A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2018 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Each year, more than 1 million children in the
- 4 United States are documented as the victims of child abuse; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2016, there were 4,416 substantiated cases of
- 6 child abuse in this Commonwealth, with 46 children dying as a
- 7 direct result of abuse and neglect and 79 children nearly losing
- 8 their lives; and
- 9 WHEREAS, These tragic numbers reflect the unsettling reality
- 10 that thousands of young children in this Commonwealth go to bed
- 11 hurt, hungry, cold and alone or live every day in fear of the
- 12 very people who should be protecting them; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Although the General Assembly has passed measures in
- 14 recent years to bolster screening for caregivers, improve
- 15 reporting, stiffen penalties and fortify investigations, child
- 16 abuse and neglect remain, and the secretiveness which surrounds

- 1 child abuse and neglect in far too many families in this
- 2 Commonwealth is especially hard to combat; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The heroin and opioid epidemic, which continues to
- 4 claim the lives of 13 Pennsylvanians every day, often victimizes
- 5 the children of parents struggling with addiction, with infants
- 6 and young children frequently left unsupervised and unsupported
- 7 in the most unsafe and unsanitary of conditions; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Child abuse crosses all racial, economic and
- 9 geographic boundaries; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The damaging effects of child abuse include school
- 11 failure, alcohol and drug abuse and physical and psychological
- 12 difficulties; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Child abuse can and must be prevented and awareness
- 14 raised so that families can learn that they have access to
- 15 community resources which offer support, information and
- 16 guidance to help stop or prevent abusive behaviors or
- 17 conditions; and
- 18 WHEREAS, By working to enhance awareness of child abuse and
- 19 prevent and end abusive behaviors and environments, we
- 20 demonstrate our collective commitment to breaking the vicious
- 21 cycle of abuse and creating a safe, nurturing, loving
- 22 environment for every infant and child in this Commonwealth; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvanians in schools, social service
- 24 agencies, churches and neighborhood groups throughout this
- 25 Commonwealth are working to support the victims of child abuse
- 26 and prevent future abuse; and
- 27 WHEREAS, In spite of these efforts, more needs to be done to
- 28 guarantee a childhood free of abuse and victimization to every
- 29 child in this Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2018

- 1 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it

- 3 RESOLVED, That the Senate commend the individuals, agencies,
- 4 churches and community groups that work to treat and prevent
- 5 child abuse and urge all Pennsylvanians to do their part in
- 6 preventing the tragedy of child abuse.
