## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An-<-act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in transfers of credits between institutions of higher education, further providing for definitions, for duties of public institutions of higher 7 8 education and State related institutions, for Transfer and Articulation Oversight Committee and for duties of department. AMENDING THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 (P.L.30, <--10 NO.14), ENTITLED "AN ACT RELATING TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL 11 SYSTEM, INCLUDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS APPLICABLE AS WELL TO 12 PRIVATE AND PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS; AMENDING, REVISING, 13 CONSOLIDATING AND CHANGING THE LAWS RELATING THERETO," IN PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS, PROVIDING FOR CAREER INFORMATION AND 15 RECRUITMENT; IN TERMS AND COURSES OF STUDY, FURTHER PROVIDING 17 FOR COMMISSION FOR AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION EXCELLENCE; IN VOCATIONAL EDUCATION, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR CAREER AND 18 TECHNICAL EDUCATION EQUIPMENT GRANTS AND PROVIDING FOR 19 UTILIZATION OF CREDITS; PROVIDING FOR CLASSIFICATION OF 20 PROGRAM CODE; AND, IN TRANSFERS OF CREDITS BETWEEN 21 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR 22 DEFINITIONS, FOR DUTIES OF PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER 23 EDUCATION AND STATE-RELATED INSTITUTIONS, FOR TRANSFER AND ARTICULATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE AND FOR DUTIES OF 25 DEPARTMENT. 26

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 1 hereby enacts as follows:
- 2 Section 1. Section 2001 C of the act of March 10, 1949
- 3 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
- 4 amended November 6, 2017 (P.L.1142, No.55), is amended to read:

- 5 Section 2001-C. Definitions.
- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this article-
- 7 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 8 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 9 "Advanced Placement Program." A program authorized by the
- 10 college board that allows a student to study college level-
- 11 subjects while enrolled in high school and to receive advanced
- 12 placement and college credit for earning a qualified score on
- 13 the course-related Advanced Placement Program exam.
- 14 "Career, technical or applied courses." Courses usually
- 15 offered as part of an associate degree curriculum designed to
- 16 prepare students for entry-level professions, not for transfer-
- 17 to baccalaureate programs for advanced studies.
- 18 "College Level Examination Program." A set of standardized
- 19 tests developed by the college board for various subjects, and
- 20 on which a qualifying score can be used to earn college credit.
- 21 "Community college." An institution created pursuant to
- 22 Article XIX A or the act of August 24, 1963 (P.L.1132, No.484),
- 23 known as the Community College Act of 1963.
- 24 "Credit for prior learning." College level credit granted
- 25 toward the award of a postsecondary degree or certificate for
- 26 experiential learning that can be demonstrated through various-
- 27 means of assessment to be the equivalent of learning gained
- 28 through formal collegiate instruction, including an Advanced
- 29 Placement Program exam, International Baccalaureate Diploma-
- 30 Program exam, a College Level Examination Program exam and

- 1 Dantes Subject Standardized Tests.
- 2 "Dantes Subject Standardized Tests." A set of subject exams
- 3 approved by the American Council on Education that tests
- 4 knowledge of both lower-level and upper-level college material.
- 5 ["Degree objective courses." Courses required for completion
- 6 of a major in a subject area.]
- 7 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 8 Commonwealth.
- 9 "Developmental or remedial courses." Courses typically
- 10 consisting of reading, writing and math designed to prepare
- 11 students for college-level courses and that are not-
- 12 <del>transferable.</del>
- 13 "Equivalent courses." Courses determined to have generally
- 14 equivalent content and level as determined by the faculty of an-
- 15 institution of higher education consistent with the policy at
- 16 each institution of higher education.
- 17 "Foundation courses." Courses required to be completed by
- 18 students that provide an academic foundation for the degree,
- 19 general education or advanced study in a major.
- 20 "Independent institution of higher education." An-
- 21 institution of higher education which is operated not for
- 22 profit, located in and incorporated or chartered by the
- 23 Commonwealth and entitled to confer degrees as set forth in 24
- 24 Pa.C.S. § 6505 (relating to power to confer degrees) and to-
- 25 apply to itself the designation "college" or "university" as-
- 26 provided for by the standards and qualifications prescribed by
- 27 the State Board of Education pursuant to 24 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65
- 28 (relating to private colleges, universities and seminaries).
- 29 <u>"Industry-recognized credential." A credential that:</u>
- 30 (1) is sought or accepted by employers within the

1	industry or sector involved as a recognized, preferred or
2	required credential for recruitment, screening, hiring,
3	retention or advancement purposes;
4	(2) where appropriate, is endorsed by a nationally
5	recognized trade association or organization representing a
6	significant part of the industry or sector; and
7	(3) is approved by the department.
8	"Institution of higher education." Any of the accredited
9	<u>following:</u>
10	(1) A public institution of higher education.
11	(2) A rural regional college.
12	(3) A State related institution.
13	(4) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.
14	"International Baccalaureate Diploma Program." An-
15	academically challenging two year precollege diploma program
16	comprised of three core requirements and six academic subject
17	areas with final examinations that prepare students, 16 to 19
18	years of age, for higher education and life in a global society.
19	"Public institution of higher education." A community
20	college or an institution which is part of the State System of
21	Higher Education pursuant to Article XX A.
22	"Public school." Any of the following:
23	(1) A school district.
24	(2) An intermediate unit.
25	(3) An area vocational technical school.
26	(4) A charter school, as defined in section 1703 A.
27	(5) A regional charter school, as defined in section
28	<del>1703 A.</del>
29	(6) A cyber charter school, as defined in section 1703
30	<del>A .</del>

1	"Rural regional college." A rural regional college operating
2	under Article XIX-G.
3	"State-related institution." The Pennsylvania State-
4	University, the University of Pittsburgh, Temple University,
5	Lincoln University and their branch campuses.
6	"Transfer and Articulation Oversight Committee." The
7	committee established under section 2004 C.
8	Section 2. Section 2003 C of the act is amended to read:
9	Section 2003-C. Duties of [public] institutions of higher
10	education and [State related institutions] public
11	schools.
12	(a) Agreements. Each [public] institution of higher
13	education and [State-related institution] <u>public school</u> shall
14	provide the Transfer and Articulation Oversight Committee and
15	the department with copies of all articulation agreements for
16	inclusion in the electronic database or software program and
17	portal provided for under section 2005-C(4) within 180 days of
18	the effective date of this section and within 30 days of
19	entering into any subsequent articulation agreement.
20	(b) Reporting requirements. The following shall apply to
21	reporting requirements:
22	(1) Each [public] institution of higher education [and
23	State related institution   shall submit to the department a
24	series of interim reports that describe the status of the
25	institution's articulation agreements, which shall include
26	all of the following:
27	(i) The number of students who have transferred to
28	the [public] institution of higher education [or State-
29	related institution by institution of origin within the
30	last academic year or since submittal of the

11	(v) Any other information related to the credit
12	transfer process as requested by the department,
13	including the useability of transfer credits.

17	effective date of this section and by September 30 of each

29	awards credit for an industry recognized credential,
30	update the database and post each articulation

4	(C) An institution which is not subject to the
5	duties under section 2003 C may submit to the
6	department any articulation agreement or agreement

10	that awards credit for an industry recognized
11	credential shall be subject to this paragraph.

- 17 EMPLOYMENT TRAINING OR CAREER OPPORTUNITIES, INDIVIDUALLY OR IN
- 18 A GROUP SETTING, THROUGH MAKING A PRESENTATION AT A SCHOOL
- 19 ASSEMBLY, HOSTING STUDENTS FOR A VISIT TO AN AREA VOCATIONAL-
- 20 TECHNICAL SCHOOL, COMMUNITY COLLEGE, INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
- 21 EDUCATION OR PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT OR ANY OTHER METHOD OF SPEAKING

- 23 (2) DOCUMENT ANNUALLY THE FOLLOWING IN THE PLAN DEVELOPED
- 24 UNDER 22 PA. CODE § 339.31 (RELATING TO PLAN):
- 25 (I) THE SCHOOL ENTITY'S COMPLIANCE WITH THIS SECTION FOR THE
- 26 IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING SCHOOL YEAR.
- 27 (II) THE SCHOOL ENTITY'S PLAN TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH
- 28 ACCESS TO INFORMATIONAL MATERIALS AND CAREER PRESENTERS AS
