## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for a fostering independence waiver program for youth 2 who are or have been in substitute care.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Fostering
- 7 Independence Through Education Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Adoption." Adoption of an individual who has been in the
- 13 care and custody of a county agency and in substitute care.
- 14 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 15 Agency.
- 16 "County agency." The term as defined under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6303

- 1 (relating to definitions).
- 2 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 3 Commonwealth.
- 4 "Dependent child." The term as defined under 42 Pa.C.S. §
- 5 6302 (relating to definitions).
- 6 "Fostering independence waiver." A waiver of tuition and
- 7 mandatory fees at an institution of higher education.
- 8 "Institution of higher education." The term includes any of
- 9 the following:
- 10 (1) A community college operating under Article XIX-A of
- 11 the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the
- 12 Public School Code of 1949.
- 13 (2) A university within the State System of Higher
- 14 Education.
- 15 (3) The Pennsylvania State University, the University of
- 16 Pittsburgh, Temple University, Lincoln University or any
- other institution designated as State-related by the
- 18 Commonwealth.
- 19 (4) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.
- 20 (5) A college established under Article XIX-G of the
- 21 Public School Code of 1949.
- 22 (6) An institution of higher education located in and
- incorporated or chartered by the Commonwealth and entitled to
- confer degrees as provided under 24 Pa.C.S. § 6505 (relating
- to power to confer degrees) and as provided for by the
- 26 standards and qualifications prescribed by the State Board of
- 27 Education under 24 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 (relating to private
- colleges, universities and seminaries).
- 29 (7) A private school licensed under the act of December
- 30 15, 1986 (P.L.1585, No.174), known as the Private Licensed

- 1 Schools Act.
- 2 (8) A foreign corporation approved to operate an
- 3 educational enterprise under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 36 (relating to
- 4 foreign corporation standards).
- 5 "Permanent legal custodian." A person to whom legal custody
- 6 of a child has been given by order of a court pursuant to 42
- 7 Pa.C.S. § 6351(a)(2.1) (relating to disposition of dependent
- 8 child).
- 9 "POC." The point of contact designated in section 5.
- 10 "Program." The fostering independence waiver program
- 11 established in section 3.
- "Substitute care." Out-of-home placement in a setting that
- 13 provides 24-hour care for a dependent child as defined in 42
- 14 Pa.C.S. § 6302 made pursuant to an order of the court.
- 15 Section 3. Fostering independence waiver program.
- 16 (a) Establishment.--There is established a fostering
- 17 independence waiver program for individuals who satisfy the
- 18 eligibility requirements under subsection (c).
- 19 (b) Award.--Beginning with the semester starting in the fall
- 20 of 2020, each institution of higher education shall award a
- 21 fostering independence waiver for undergraduate courses at the
- 22 institution for each individual who is eligible under subsection
- 23 (c). The fostering independence waiver shall have subtracted
- 24 from it the amount of any Federal grants, State grants or other
- 25 scholarships or grants the individual receives. An individual
- 26 shall receive a fostering independence waiver under this act for
- 27 five years, whether or not consecutive, or until the individual
- 28 reaches 26 years of age, whichever occurs first, as long as the
- 29 individual remains eligible under subsection (c).
- 30 (c) Eligibility.--In order to receive a fostering

- 1 independence waiver under this section, an individual must meet
- 2 all of the following requirements:
- 3 (1) Be at least 14 years of age but under 26 years of
- 4 age and be in or have been in substitute care in this
- 5 Commonwealth for at least six months before, on or after the
- 6 effective date of this section, including any of the
- 7 following:
- 8 (i) Placement in substitute care as a dependent
- 9 child at any time while 14 years of age or older.
- 10 (ii) Adoption at any time after reaching 14 years of
- age from substitute care as a dependent child.
- 12 (iii) Placement with a permanent legal custodian at
- any time after reaching 14 years of age from substitute
- 14 care as a dependent child.
- 15 (2) Have graduated from high school or received a
- 16 Commonwealth secondary school diploma or another equivalent
- approved by the Department of Education.
- 18 (3) Have been accepted for admission to, or be currently
- 19 attending, an institution of higher education.
- 20 (4) Have maintained satisfactory progress after
- 21 admission as defined by the institution of higher education
- 22 attended.
- 23 (5) Have applied for all available Federal and State
- 24 grants.
- 25 (6) Currently resides in this Commonwealth.
- 26 (d) Accessibility.--The department shall work with the
- 27 agency as well as the Department of Labor and Industry and the
- 28 Department of Human Services to ensure that individuals eligible
- 29 for the program under subsection (c) apply for all available
- 30 Federal and State grants.

- 1 Section 4. Outreach.
- 2 (a) Duties of department. -- The department, in conjunction
- 3 with the Department of Human Services, shall do all of the
- 4 following:
- 5 (1) By January 1, 2020, and January 1 each year
- 6 thereafter, prepare and provide the information to be
- 7 disseminated by county agencies, the department, the
- 8 Department of Human Services and institutions of higher
- 9 education which:
- 10 (i) Describes the availability of the program
- 11 established under this act.
- 12 (ii) Explains how to participate in the program.
- 13 (iii) Includes information on all available Federal
- and State grants identified under section 3(d).
- 15 (2) Ensure that identified individuals who may be
- eligible for services and programs under section 1738-E of
- 17 the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The
- 18 Fiscal Code, are informed of these services and programs.
- 19 (b) Duties of institutions of higher education. -- Each
- 20 institution of higher education shall do all of the following:
- 21 (1) Through the POC required under section 5, provide
- 22 technical assistance to individuals who are eliqible under
- section 3(c) in completing admissions applications and
- financial aid applications.
- 25 (2) Disseminate the information prepared under
- 26 subsection (a) (1) to all applicants for admission and to-
- 27 prospective applicants for admission. An institution of
- 28 higher education may comply with this paragraph by including
- 29 a paper or electronic copy of the information with other-
- 30 information or notifications provided to the applicant for-

- 7 (3) To improve retention, report to the department by 8 June 30, 2021, and June 30 each year thereafter all of the 9 following:

  1882).
- 14 (ii) The number of students who apply for the program.
- 16 (iii) The number of students participating in the 17 program.
- 18 (iv) The retention rates of students participating
  19 in the program.
  - (v) The number of students who are participating in the program and have unmet financial need.
  - (vi) Recommendations on how to improve outreach to students who are or are potentially eligible for the program.
- (vii) Recommendations on ways in which to improve the delivery of services to students who are eligible under section 3(c).
- 28 (viii) Impediments to retaining students who are eligible under section 3(c).
- 30 (4) The department may not require any other information

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- 1 to be provided by an institution of higher education, except
- 2 as provided under paragraph (3).
- 3 Section 5. Point of contact.
- 4 Each institution of higher education shall designate an
- 5 appropriate staff person or persons as the point of contact for
- 6 students eligible for the program. The POC may be comprised of
- 7 one or more qualified staff members to provide the appropriate
- 8 support or expertise required for the duties specified in this
- 9 section. The POC shall have or ensure the delegation of the
- 10 following duties:
- 11 (1) Assist students in obtaining verification of
- 12 eligibility for the program from the courts, the county
- agency or the Department of Human Services.
- 14 (2) Assist individuals who are eligible under section
- 15 3(c) in accessing available Federal and State financial aid
- 16 resources and in identifying further scholarship and grant
- 17 opportunities, in consultation with the institution's
- 18 financial aid department.
- 19 (3) Serve as the primary contact for all individuals
- applying to or attending the institution who are eligible
- 21 under section 3(c).
- 22 (4) Provide all individuals applying to or attending the
- 23 institution who voluntarily disclose that they are eliqible
- under section 3(c) with information and referrals for on-
- 25 campus support services and resources, including admissions,
- housing, financial aid, health, mental health, tutoring,
- career, academic advising and other services.
- 28 (5) Provide all individuals applying to or attending the
- 29 institution who are eliqible under section 3(c) with
- information and referrals as available for off-campus support

- 1 services, including transitional housing and medical
- 2 insurance and services.
- 3 (6) Post POC contact information on the publicly
- 4 accessible Internet website of the institution of higher
- 5 education.
- 6 Section 6. Report.
- 7 In order to determine and maximize the effectiveness of this
- 8 act, the department, in conjunction with the Department of Human
- 9 Services, shall collect information obtained from all
- 10 institutions of higher education under section 4(b)(3) and
- 11 prepare an anonymized report to be submitted by August 31, 2021,
- 12 and by August 31 of each year thereafter, to the chairperson and
- 13 minority chairperson of the Education Committee of the Senate,
- 14 the chairperson and minority chairperson of the Education
- 15 Committee of the House of Representatives, the chairperson and
- 16 minority chairperson of the Health and Human Services Committee
- 17 of the Senate and the chairperson and minority chairperson of
- 18 the Children and Youth Committee of the House of Representatives
- 19 that contains all of the following:
- 20 (1) The number of students receiving a Pennsylvania

- 6 (8) Impediments to retaining students who are eligible
- 7 under section 3(c).
- 8 Section 7. Effective date.
- 9 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
