AN ACT

- Establishing the Integrated Student Supports Program and the Integrated Student Supports Fund; and conferring powers and
- imposing duties on the Department of Education.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Integrated
- 8 Student Supports Act.
- 9 Section 2. Legislative intent.
- 10 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 11 (1) High school dropout rates can have a significant
- 12 negative impact on this Commonwealth's economy as determined
- 13 by the loss of generated income tax revenue and dependence on
- 14 government aid, as well as elevated risks for incarceration.
- 15 (2) Graduation rates in many Pennsylvania school
- districts have fallen well below the Statewide average.
- 17 Removing academic and nonacademic barriers to learning

- 1 through evidence-based integrated student supports helps to
- 2 reduce dropout rates and increase graduation rates.
- 3 (3) The General Assembly intends to create a fund
- 4 allowing Pennsylvania public school entities to utilize
- 5 programming provided by a third-party nonprofit organization
- 6 in order to decrease dropout rates and increase graduation
- 7 rates.
- 8 Section 3. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 13 Commonwealth.
- 14 "Fund." The Integrated Student Supports Fund established in
- 15 section 4(c).
- 16 "Organization." The third-party nonprofit organization
- 17 designated by the department under section 4(b).
- 18 "Program." The Integrated Student Supports Program
- 19 established in section 4(a).
- 20 "Public school entity." Any of the following:
- 21 (1) A school district as defined in section 102 of the
- 22 act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public
- 23 School Code of 1949.
- 24 (2) A charter school, cyber charter school or regional
- 25 charter school as defined in section 1703-A of the Public
- 26 School Code of 1949.
- 27 (3) An intermediate unit as established under Article
- 28 IX-A of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 29 (4) An area vocational-technical school as established
- 30 under Article XVIII of the Public School Code of 1949.

- 1 Section 4. Integrated Student Supports Program.
- 2 (a) Establishment. -- The Integrated Student Supports Program
- 3 is established to remove academic and nonacademic barriers to
- 4 learning as a means to enhance student academic success,
- 5 decrease dropout rates and increase graduation rates in public
- 6 elementary and secondary schools throughout this Commonwealth.
- 7 Under the program, the department may provide grants to public
- 8 school entities as provided under section 5 for students in
- 9 kindergarten through grade 12.
- 10 (b) Designation. --
- 11 (1) Within 60 days of the effective date of this 12 section, the Secretary of Education shall:
- 13 (i) Designate, through a request for proposal
 14 process, an organization to serve as the provider of
 15 evidence-based community school services to public school
 16 entities. The organization must satisfy all of the
 17 following:
- 18 (A) Currently operate in more than 60 public school entities.
- 20 (B) Provide independent data collection.
- 21 (C) Provide in-school and out-of-school programs 22 in the following areas:
- 23 (I) Social, emotional, physical and moral
 24 development to include mental health case
 25 management.
- 26 (II) College and career preparation.
- 27 (III) Behavior intervention.
- 28 (IV) Parental engagement and support.
- 29 (V) Student reengagement.
- 30 (ii) Post notice of the designation on the

- department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 2 (2) This subsection shall be subject to the provisions
- of 62 Pa.C.S. (relating to Procurement).
- 4 (c) Fund. -- The Integrated Student Supports Fund is
- 5 established in the State Treasury. Money in the fund shall be
- 6 used to fund the grants provided under section 5. The following
- 7 shall apply:
- 8 (1) The department may transfer undistributed money not
- 9 expended, encumbered or committed from the department's
- 10 appropriation to the fund for the purpose of funding the
- 11 grants provided under this section.
- 12 (2) The fund may include:
- 13 (i) Grants, donations, contributions or gifts from
- 14 public or private sources specifically earmarked for
- deposit into the fund.
- 16 (ii) Interest, dividends and pecuniary gains from
- investment of money in the fund.
- 18 Section 5. Grants.
- 19 (a) Establishment of advisory councils. -- Each public school
- 20 entity shall establish and manage an advisory council that shall
- 21 develop the strategic school plan for students in kindergarten
- 22 through grade 12. An advisory council shall be comprised of a
- 23 diverse set of public and private stakeholders, including
- 24 representatives from the public school entity, local and
- 25 regional industries, private philanthropic foundations,
- 26 community-based organizations and social service agencies.
- 27 (b) Provision of grants.--
- 28 (1) The department may provide grants to a public school
- 29 entity for the purpose of funding the implementation of the
- 30 approved strategic plan to provide integrated student

- supports to remove academic and nonacademic barriers to education.
- 3 (2) A public school entity seeking funds under this subsection must submit a strategic plan for programming for 4 5 students in kindergarten through grade 12 to the department. 6 Grants shall be awarded on a competitive basis, based on the 7 department's review of a public school entity's strategic 8 plan, and shall match the public school entity's proposed 9 investment amount in programming on a dollar-for-dollar basis. Strategic plans submitted to the department must 10 11 demonstrate that a dedicated space exists or will exist 12 within the public school entity for the use of the integrated
- 14 (3) Grants awarded to public school entities under this
 15 subsection shall be used in their entirety for the
 16 programming provided by the organization selected by the
 17 department.
- 18 Section 6. Reports.

- 19 (a) Annual report. -- The organization shall provide a report
- 20 on the progress of the organization's evidence-based programming
- 21 within each public school entity receiving a grant under section
- 22 5 to the department within one year of the effective date of
- 23 this section and annually no later than October 1 of each
- 24 subsequent year thereafter. The report shall include outcomes
- 25 for case-managed students, including the following:
- 26 (1) Grade promotion and graduation rates.
- 27 (2) Student attendance.
- 28 (3) Student behavior.
- 29 (4) Student academics and grade point averages.
- 30 (b) Publication. -- The report shall be published annually on

- 1 the department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 2 Section 7. Effective date.
- 3 This act shall take effect immediately.
