Short title. 19 <---20 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Regional-21 Response Health Collaborative Act. Section 2. Definitions. 22 23 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 24 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 25 context clearly indicates otherwise: 26 "Assisted living residence." As defined in section 1001 of 27 the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human-28 Services Code. 29 "COVID 19." The novel coronavirus as identified in the 30 Governor's Proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued on March 6, 31 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020). 32 "Department." The Department of Human Services of the 33 Commonwealth. 34 "Emergency medical services agency." As defined in 35-35 Pa.C.S. § 8103 (relating to definitions). 36 "Facility." Any of the following: 37 (1) An assisted living residence. 38 (2) A long term care nursing facility.

2	"Federal funds." Funds received from the Federal Government
3	to fight COVID-19 under the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and
4	Economic Security Act (Public Law 116-136, 134 Stat. 281).
5	"Health collaborative." A collaboration of a local health
6	care system that provides educational support and clinical
7	coaching in a specific region of this Commonwealth.
8	"Long term care nursing facility." As defined in section
9	802.1 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the
10	Health Care Facilities Act.
11	"Personal care home." As defined in section 1001 of the-
12	Human Services Code.
13	"Region." The following areas of this Commonwealth:
14	(1) Northeast.
15	(2) Southeast.
16	(3) North central.
17	(4) South central.
18	(5) Northwest.
19	(6) Southwest.
20	Section 3. Regional response health collaborative.
21	(a) Division The department shall divide this Commonwealth
22	into regions and shall delineate all of the facilities within
23	the parameters of a region.
24	(b) Proposals. The department shall solicit proposals from
25	health collaboratives to provide operations, management and
26	administration of the purposes provided under subsection (e) in
27	each region to protect residents in facilities from COVID-19.
28	(c) Contract. The department, in consultation with the
29	Secretary of Health, shall contract with at least one health
30	collaborative in each region for the purposes provided under
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1 subsection (e).

2	(d) Appropriation. The amount of \$500,000,000 of the	
3	Federal funds is appropriated to the department for the purposes-	
4	of this act. The department shall distribute the funds to each	
5	health collaborative contracted under subsection (c).	
6	(e) Purpose. Each health collaborative shall:	
7	(1) Promote health and stabilize the economy of the	
8	region by directly supporting COVID 19 readiness and response	
9	9 in facilities.	
10) (2) Improve the quality of care related to infection	
11	1 prevention and other priority health care conditions common	
12	to facilities.	
13	(3) Expand COVID-19 testing to include asymptomatic-	
14	staff and residents in facilities to expand public health	
15	surveillance.	
16	Section 4. Duties.	
17	(a) ReviewEach health collaborative shall perform daily-	
18	strategic review of facilities in their region.	
19	(b) PlanThrough collaborative review of the clinical-	
20	situation within facilities identified as having unmet needs, a	
21	health collaborative shall formulate an action plan tailored to	
22	the facility, identifying specific resources or tactical actions-	
23	to implement to assist facilities.	
24	(c) Components. A health collaborative shall provide for	
25	the following as provided under section 5:	
26	(1) Enhanced testing capability.	
27	(2) Infection control consultation and implementation,	
28	including contact tracing.	
29	(3) Advanced clinical care, including remote monitoring	
30	and physician consultation.	

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1	(d) FundsA health collaborative shall:
2	(1) budget for and distribute funds provided by the
3	department; and
4	(2) track and record the expense associated with each
5	type of testing and with implementing infection control
6	consultation across the region.
7	Section 5. Components.
8	(a) Enhanced testing
9	(1) If a facility experiences a positive test of COVID-
10	19, testing of facility residents and health care workers
11	shall be conducted. Onsite testing shall be made available
12	through mobile testing teams developed by the health
13	collaborative. The health collaborative shall coordinate the
14	testing response with participation from local emergency-
15	medical services agencies and regional testing laboratories
16	to prioritize receipt of test results.
17	(2) A health collaborative shall deploy systematic-
18	surveillance testing on a weekly basis using a random-
19	sampling of not more than five asymptomatic residents in a
20	facility. Results of the testing shall be shared with all-
21	stakeholders and the Commonwealth.
22	(b) Infection control and consultation A health-
23	collaborative shall deploy clinical staff to perform onsite
24	observation and consultation as part of the mobile testing team.
25	The clinical staff shall:
26	(1) implement infection control practices, such as-
27	cohorting, personal protective equipment use, case detection-
28	and staffing practices; and
29	(2) facilitate completion of exposure tracing studies.
30	(c) Advanced clinical management assistance. Clinical staff

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1	shall provide onsite and telemedicine-supported clinical care	
2	for a facility.
