- award in fiscal year 2019-2020 under section 7823 (relating

- 17 (4) An EMS company that did not apply for or receive a
- 18 grant award in fiscal year 2019-2020 under section 7823 and
- 19 that applies for a grant under this subchapter for the
- 20 purposes under section 7823(a).
- 21 (b) Amount of award. -- The amount of the grant award under
- 22 this subchapter shall be the same amount of the grant award for
- 23 fiscal year 2019-2020 to:
- 24 (1) An eligible fire company under section 7813.
- 25 (2) An eligible EMS company under section 7823.
- 26 (c) Application not required.--
