## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending Title 25 (Elections) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in registration system, further providing for SURE system; in voter registration, further providing for approval of registration applications; in records, further providing for public information lists; and, in changes in records, further providing for removal notices, for transfer of registration and for death of registrant.

9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1222 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania
11	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read:
12	§ 1222. SURE system.

14	(c.1) Coordination with local registrars
15	(1) The department shall establish a process to cross-
16	reference the department's database of registered electors
17	with death record information from local registrars, which
18	shall be conducted at least once each calendar month. A
19	registered elector whose first and last name, date of birth

1	and last four digits of his Social Security number are found
2	<u>on a death record shall be subject to immediate removal from</u>
3	the SURE system.
4	(2) The local commission shall notify the elector by
5	mail of its action.
6	(3) No registered elector may be removed within 30 days
7	of an election.
8	(4) As used in this subsection, the term "local
9	registrar" means a local registrar under the supervision of
10	the Department of Health in accordance with Article III of
11	the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), known as the Vital
12	<u>Statistics Law of 1953.</u>

20	(3) Upon receipt of a notice of address change in

23	individual's former county of residence shall investigate.

25	another state of residence, the commission shall cancel the
26	registered elector's registration. The commission shall
27	promptly update information contained in their registration

17 (b) Use.--A registered elector who removes residence from 18 one place to another [within the same county] must notify the commission by filing a removal notice under subsection (a) or a 19 20 signed request for renewal that contains the information 21 required in subsection (a) with the commission not later than 22 the registration deadline before an election. If mailed, the 23 notice or request must be postmarked not later than the deadline 24 for registration or, in the case of an illegible or missing 25 postmark, received within five days of the close of 26 registration. 28 (4) A registered elector who removes residence from this
29 Commonwealth to another state and who is not registered to
30 vote in the new state of residence shall be permitted to vote

1	in the election district in this Commonwealth if, at the time
2	of signing the elector's certificate, the elector files with
3	the judge of election a signed affirmation declaring the
4	elector's new residence. A registered elector may vote in the
5	election district of the elector's former residence not more
6	than one time following the elector's removal. Affirmations
7	made under this paragraph shall be returned to the commission
8	of the elector's former county of residence and that
9	commission shall proceed to transfer the registration of the
10	elector under section 1502. Upon receipt of the address
11	change under section 1323(a)(3) (relating to application with

26	Commonwealth to another state, if the signature appears
27	authentic, the commission shall cancel the registration of
28	the elector and notify the elector's new state of residence.

(b) Other sources.--A commission may also utilize published 3 newspaper obituaries, letters testamentary [or]\_ letters of 4 administration issued by the office of the registrar of wills or 5 any other source of verified data to cancel and remove the 6 registration of an elector, provided that such removals are 7 uniform, nondiscriminatory and in compliance with the Voting 8 9 Rights Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-110, 42 U.S.C. § 1973 et seq.). The commission shall promptly update information 10 contained in its registration records. 11
