Amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for fireworks; imposing penalties; and making a related repeal. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. - 11 § 1101. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 15 "APA 87-1." The American Pyrotechnics Association Standard
- 16 <u>87-1: Standard for Construction and Approval for Transportation</u>
- 17 of Fireworks, Novelties, and Theatrical Pyrotechnics, 2001
- 18 <u>edition</u>.
- 19 "Consumer fireworks." As follows:
- 20 (1) The term includes all of the following:
- 21 (i) Any combustible or explosive composition or any
- 22 substance or combination of substances intended to
- 23 produce visible or audible effects by combustion and
- 24 which is suitable for use by the public in accordance
- with the construction, performance, composition and
- labeling requirements promulgated by the CPSC in 16 CFR
- 27 <u>(relating to commercial practices) or any successor</u>
- regulation and complies with the provisions for "consumer"
- fireworks" as defined in APA 87-1.
- 30 (ii) Aerial devices and audible ground devices.

- 1 (2) The term does not include "ground" and "handheld
- 2 sparkling devices, " "novelties" and "toy caps" in APA 87-1,
- 3 which may be sold, possessed and used at all times in this
- 4 Commonwealth.
- 5 <u>"CPSC." The United States Consumer Product Safety</u>
- 6 <u>Commission</u>.
- 7 <u>"Department." The Department of Agriculture of the</u>
- 8 Commonwealth.
- 9 <u>"Display fireworks."</u> As defined in 27 CFR 555.11 (relating
- 10 to meaning of terms).
- 11 "Municipality." A city, borough, incorporated town or
- 12 <u>township.</u>
- 13 § 1102. Bond requirement.
- 14 The governing body of a municipality shall require a bond
- 15 from a person who holds a permit to use consumer fireworks or
- 16 display fireworks in a sum not less than \$500 conditioned for
- 17 the payment of all damages which may be caused to a person or
- 18 property by reason of the fireworks display and arising from any
- 19 acts of the permittee or the permittee's agents, employees or
- 20 <u>subcontractors</u>.
- 21 § 1103. Permit extension.
- 22 The following apply:
- 23 (1) If unfavorable weather causes a fireworks display
- for which a permit has been granted not to take place at the
- 25 time authorized, the person who holds a permit for the
- display may within 24 hours apply to the governing body of a
- 27 <u>municipality which granted the permit for an extension of the</u>
- 28 permit.
- 29 (2) The application under paragraph (1) shall attest
- 30 that the fireworks display did not occur, provide the reasons

- 1 why the display did not occur and request a continuance of
- 2 the permit for a day designated in the permit no later than
- 3 one week after the day fixed originally in the permit.
- 4 (3) Upon receiving an application under paragraph (1),
- 5 <u>if the governing body of the municipality concludes that the</u>
- facts in the application are true, the governing body of the
- 7 <u>municipality shall extend the provisions of the permit to the</u>
- 8 <u>day designated in the application. The extension of time</u>
- 9 <u>shall be granted without the payment of an additional fee and</u>
- 10 without requiring a bond other than the bond under section
- 11 1102 (relating to bond requirement). The bond under section
- 12 <u>1102 shall extend to and cover all damages which may be</u>
- 13 <u>caused by reason of the fireworks display taking place at the</u>
- 14 <u>extended date in the same manner and to the same extent as if</u>
- 15 <u>the display had taken place at the date originally fixed in</u>
- the permit.
- 17 § 1104. Consumer fireworks and display fireworks.
- 18 (a) Construction. -- Nothing in this chapter shall be
- 19 construed to prohibit a facility licensed under this chapter
- 20 from selling consumer fireworks, including the year-round sale
- 21 of consumer fireworks, to an out-of-State resident whose status
- 22 is verified to the licensee if the licensee retains proof of the
- 23 verified status, produces proof of the verified status for
- 24 review upon request by the department and the consumer fireworks
- 25 are transported directly out of State by the seller or
- 26 purchaser.
- 27 (b) Authorization.--Consumer fireworks and display fireworks
- 28 may be purchased and possessed by a person holding a permit from
- 29 a municipality for use in any of the following circumstances, as
- 30 authorized in such permit:

- 1 (1) At a fireworks display.
- 2 (2) Agricultural purposes in connection with the raising
- 3 of crops and the protection of crops from bird and animal
- 4 <u>damage</u>.
- 5 (3) By railroads or other transportation agencies for
- 6 <u>signal purposes or illumination.</u>
- 7 (4) In quarrying or for blasting or other industrial
- 8 <u>use.</u>
- 9 (5) Blank cartridges for a show or theater, including
- the sale of blank cartridges for a show or theater.
- 11 (6) Signal or ceremonial purposes in athletics or
- 12 sports.
- 13 (7) By military organizations or organizations composed
- of veterans of the United States Armed Forces.
- 15 (c) Prohibition. -- A permit for use of consumer fireworks and
- 16 <u>display fireworks may not be issued to an individual under 18</u>
- 17 years of age.
- 18 § 1105. Agricultural and display permits.
- 19 <u>(a) Agricultural permits.--The following apply:</u>
- 20 (1) The governing body of a municipality may, in
- 21 accordance with the reasonable rules or regulations adopted
- 22 by the governing body of the municipality, grant permits for
- 23 the use of suitable fireworks for agricultural purposes in
- 24 connection with the raising of crops and the protection of
- 25 crops from bird and animal damage.
- 26 (2) A permit granted under this subsection shall be
- 27 <u>valid for the calendar year when the permit was issued.</u>
- 28 (3) After a permit is granted under this subsection, the
- 29 sale, possession and use of fireworks of the type and for the
- 30 purpose mentioned in the permit shall be lawful for that

- 1 purpose only.
- 2 (b) Display permits. -- The following apply:
- 3 (1) The governing body of a municipality may, in
- 4 <u>accordance with the reasonable rules or regulations adopted</u>
- 5 by the governing body of the municipality, grant permits for
- 6 <u>displays of consumer fireworks and display fireworks.</u>
- 7 (2) A fireworks display under this subsection shall be
- 8 <u>handled by a competent operator.</u>
- 9 (3) In the determination of the chief of the fire
- department or other officer as may be designated by the
- 11 governing body of the municipality and after proper
- 12 <u>inspection, a fireworks display under this subsection shall</u>
- be located, discharged or fired as not to be hazardous to a
- 14 <u>property or endanger a person.</u>
- 15 (4) After a permit is granted under this subsection, the
- 16 purchase, possession and use of consumer fireworks and
- display fireworks for the fireworks display shall be lawful
- for that purpose only. The permit shall not be transferable.
- 19 § 1106. Consumer fireworks sales.
- 20 Consumer fireworks shall be sold only from a facility which
- 21 is licensed by the department and meets the following criteria:
- 22 (1) The facility shall comply with the provisions of the
- 23 <u>act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the</u>
- 24 Pennsylvania Construction Code Act.
- 25 (2) The facility shall be in a stand-alone building and
- shall be no larger than 12,000 square feet.
- 27 (3) Storage areas shall be separated from wholesale or
- retail sales areas to which a purchaser may be admitted by
- 29 <u>appropriately rated fire separation.</u>
- 30 (4) The facility shall be located no closer than 250

- 1 <u>feet from any facility selling or dispensing gasoline,</u>
- 2 <u>propane or other such flammable products.</u>
- 3 <u>(5) The facility shall be located at least 250 feet from</u>
- 4 any other facility licensed to sell consumer fireworks.
- 5 (6) The facility shall have a monitored burglar and fire
- 6 <u>alarm system.</u>
- 7 (7) Quarterly fire drills and preplanning meetings shall
- 8 <u>be conducted as required by the primary fire department.</u>
- 9 § 1107. Applications for licenses to sell consumer fireworks.
- 10 (a) Applications. -- An application for a license to sell
- 11 consumer fireworks must be submitted to the department on forms
- 12 prescribed and provided by the department. The application shall
- 13 <u>be accompanied by an annual license fee of \$5,000 per location.</u>
- 14 <u>(b) Inspection.--The following apply:</u>
- 15 (1) A facility in existence on the effective date of
- this section and a new facility shall be inspected by the
- department within 30 days of receipt of a complete
- 18 application for a license. The department shall issue a
- 19 <u>license or deny a license within 14 days of completing the</u>
- 20 inspection.
- 21 (2) A license shall be effective for one year from the
- date the license is issued, and renewal of a license shall be
- 23 <u>automatic upon payment of the license fee.</u>
- 24 (3) Each licensed facility shall be subject to an annual
- 25 inspection by the department and at other times in the
- discretion of the department during normal business hours.
- 27 <u>(c) Prohibition.--No license for the sale of consumer</u>
- 28 fireworks shall be issued to a convicted felon or to an entity
- 29 where a convicted felon owns any percentage of the equity
- 30 interest in the entity.

- 1 § 1108. Licensed facility operations.
- 2 (a) Operations. -- A facility licensed under section 1107
- 3 (relating to applications for licenses to sell consumer
- 4 <u>fireworks</u>) shall be exclusively dedicated to the storage and
- 5 <u>sale of consumer fireworks and related items and the licensed</u>
- 6 <u>facility shall operate in accordance with the following:</u>
- 7 (1) There shall be security personnel on the premises of
- 8 the licensed facility from June 28 through July 4 of each
- 9 <u>year and from December 30 through January 2 of each year.</u>
- 10 (2) No smoking shall be permitted in the licensed
- 11 <u>facility.</u>
- 12 (3) No cigarettes or tobacco products, matches, lighters
- or any other flame-producing devices shall be permitted to be
- 14 <u>taken into the licensed facility.</u>
- 15 (4) No individual under 18 years of age shall be
- 16 permitted in the licensed facility unless accompanied by an
- 17 adult and an individual under 18 years of age shall stay with
- 18 an adult in the licensed facility.
- 19 (5) The licensed facility shall carry at least
- \$2,000,000 in public and product liability insurance.
- 21 (6) No display fireworks shall be stored or located at a
- 22 licensed facility.
- 23 (7) No individual who appears to be under the influence
- of intoxicating liquor or drugs shall be admitted to the
- 25 <u>licensed facility and no liquor, beer or wine shall be</u>
- 26 permitted in the licensed facility.
- 27 (8) No consumer fireworks or display fireworks shall be
- ignited within 300 feet of the licensed facility.
- 29 (9) Emergency evacuation plans shall be conspicuously
- 30 posted in appropriate locations within the licensed facility.

- 1 (b) Training.--A licensee shall provide the licensee's
- 2 <u>employees with documented training in the area of operational</u>
- 3 safety of a facility. The licensee shall provide written
- 4 <u>documentation to the department showing that each employee has</u>
- 5 <u>received training under this subsection.</u>
- 6 § 1109. Registration with Attorney General.
- 7 An entity which performs, provides or supervises fireworks
- 8 <u>displays or exhibitions for profit shall register annually with</u>
- 9 the Attorney General in accordance with 37 Pa. Code Ch. 711
- 10 (relating to registration for fireworks displays).
- 11 <u>§ 1110. Penalties.</u>
- 12 (a) Use of consumer fireworks. -- A person who uses consumer
- 13 <u>fireworks in violation of the provisions of this chapter</u>
- 14 commits a summary offense and, upon conviction, shall be
- 15 <u>sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$500 and the following</u>
- 16 shall apply:
- 17 (1) A person using consumer or display fireworks in
- 18 violation of the provisions of this chapter for a second or
- 19 <u>subsequent offense shall be sentenced to pay a fine of</u>
- 20 \$1,000.
- 21 (2) In addition to the penalty under paragraph (1), each
- firework in the possession of a person using fireworks in
- 23 <u>violation of the provisions of this chapter for a second or</u>
- subsequent offense shall be confiscated and disposed of by
- law enforcement.
- 26 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
- 27 <u>contrary, money collected from fines under this section shall</u>
- be retained by the municipality in which the violation
- occurred and shall be used by law enforcement to increase
- 30 enforcement actions related to violations under this section.

- 1 (b) Sale of consumer fireworks. -- A person who sells consumer
- 2 fireworks in violation of the provisions of this chapter commits
- 3 <u>a misdemeanor of the second degree.</u>
- 4 (c) Sale of display fireworks. -- A person who sells display
- 5 <u>fireworks in violation of the provisions of this chapter commits</u>
- 6 <u>a felony of the third degree.</u>
- 7 (d) Sale of illegal explosives. -- A person commits a felony
- 8 of the third degree if the person sells any of the following:
- 9 (1) Illegal explosives as specified in 49 CFR 173.54
- 10 (relating to forbidden explosives).
- 11 (2) Illegal explosives in violation of any Federal law.
- 12 (3) Any explosive devices which have not been tested,
- 13 <u>approved and labeled by the United States Department of</u>
- 14 <u>Transportation</u>, including, but not limited to, those devices
- commonly referred to as "M-80," "M-100," "blockbuster,"
- "cherry bomb," "quarter stick" or "half stick."
- 17 § 1111. Removal of illegal fireworks.
- The Pennsylvania State Police, an individual employed as a
- 19 municipal police officer as defined in 42 Pa.C.S. § 8951
- 20 (relating to definitions) who holds a current certificate under
- 21 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to municipal police
- 22 education and training), a sheriff or a deputy sheriff shall
- 23 take, remove or cause to be removed at the expense of the owner
- 24 all stocks of consumer fireworks or display fireworks or
- 25 combustibles used, offered or exposed for sale, stored or held
- 26 in violation of this chapter. The owner shall be responsible for
- 27 the storage and, if deemed necessary, the destruction of the
- 28 illegal fireworks.
- 29 Section 3. Repeals are as follows:
- 30 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under

- 1 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of 3
- 2 Pa.C.S. Ch. 11.
- 3 (2) Article XXIV of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6,
- No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is repealed.
- 5 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
