## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for access to long-term care facilities for members of
- the clergy, for additional safety requirements for residents,
- for suspension of access for members of the clergy and for
- 4 personal protective equipment for members of the clergy.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Religious
- 9 Liberty in Long-Term Care Facilities Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Declaration of disaster emergency." A disaster emergency
- 15 declared by the Governor under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to
- 16 general authority of Governor).
- 17 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.

- 1 "Lock-down phase." A period of time a long-term care
- 2 facility restricts visitation from the general public to
- 3 residents of the facility.
- 4 "Long-term care facility." A facility licensed by the
- 5 department or the Department of Human Services, including, but
- 6 not limited to, a long-term care nursing facility, a skilled
- 7 nursing facility, an assisted living facility, OR a personal

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- 8 care home. or an independent long term care facility.
- 9 "Member of the clergy." A clergyman, priest, rabbi,
- 10 minister, Christian Science practitioner, religious healer or
- 11 spiritual leader of any regularly established church or other
- 12 religious organization.
- 13 "Resident." An adult with established residency in a long-
- 14 term care facility.
- 15 Section 3. Access to long-term care facilities for members of
- the clergy.
- 17 The department, in consultation with the Department of Human
- 18 Services, shall establish protocols to allow a resident or an
- 19 individual with decision-making authority for the resident to
- 20 request visitation by a member of the clergy during a
- 21 declaration of disaster emergency. A member of the clergy shall
- 22 meet the necessary qualifications to enter the long-term care
- 23 facility to provide in-person physical or emotional support to a
- 24 resident of a long-term care facility on a voluntary basis and
- 25 in accordance with the protocols established under this section.
- 26 The department may update the protocols established under this
- 27 section at any time during the disaster emergency. The
- 28 department may not update the protocols established under this
- 29 section to expand the duration of the lock-down phase under
- 30 paragraph (2) for a time period exceeding 45 days. The protocols

- 1 shall include all of the following:
- 2 (1) Safety measures for members of the clergy,
- 3 including, but not limited to, restrictions on travel,
- 4 enhanced testing for communicable diseases and the necessary
- 5 safety equipment required to protect the health and safety of
- 6 the residents and staff of the long-term care facility.
- 7 (2) A duration, set by the department, in consultation
- 8 with the Department of Human Services not to exceed 45 days,
- 9 when a long-term care facility may enter a lock-down phase
- during which the long-term care facility may exclude members
- of the clergy for the purpose of establishing safety measures
- for residents and members of the clergy.
- 13 Section 4. Additional safety requirements for residents.
- 14 A long-term care facility may establish additional safety
- 15 requirements to protect the residents, including limitations on
- 16 the duration of the visits, the number of visitors per week per
- 17 resident, the location of visits and the spacing of visitors.
- 18 The requirements under this subsection shall meet all of the
- 19 following criteria:
- 20 (1) The requirements are directly linked to a
- 21 declaration of disaster emergency.
- 22 (2) The requirements are not so burdensome and onerous
- as to substantially prevent a member of the clergy from being
- 24 able to visit a resident in person.
- 25 Section 5. Suspension of access for members of the clergy.
- A long-term care facility may suspend access to a member of
- 27 the clergy who violates the protocols established under section
- 28 3, and the long-term care facility shall allow the resident, or
- 29 an individual with decision-making authority for the resident,
- 30 to immediately request another member of the clergy.

- 1 Section 6. Personal protective equipment for members of the
- 2 clergy.
- A long-term care facility may require a member of the clergy
- 4 to provide personal protective equipment for himself or herself
- 5 or assume the cost of the personal protective equipment provided
- 6 by the facility to allow the member of the clergy to access the
- 7 long-term care facility. Personal protective equipment provided
- 8 by the long-term care facility may not reduce the personal
- 9 protective equipment available to the employees and staff of the
- 10 long-term care facility.
- 11 Section 7. Applicability.
- 12 This act shall apply for the period commencing 15 days after
- 13 a declaration of disaster emergency that results in a lock-down
- 14 phase of long-term care facilities until 60 days after the
- 15 termination or expiration of the declaration of disaster
- 16 emergency by executive order, proclamation or operation of law.
- 17 Section 8. Construction.
- 18 Nothing in this act shall be construed to:
- 19 (1) prohibit or restrict long-term care facilities from
- 20 allowing members of the clergy to visit residents in a manner
- 21 deemed appropriate by the long-term care facilities before
- the effective date of section 3; or
- 23 (2) supersede Federal authority regarding long-term care
- facilities or to prevent the department or Department of
- 25 Human Services from taking necessary actions to render the
- 26 Commonwealth eligible for Federal funds or reimbursement
- 27 services provided in long-term care facilities.
- 28 Section 9. Effective date.
- 29 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
