AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled 1 "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, 2 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, 3 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating 4 and defining membership of county boards of elections; 5 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 6 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; 7 imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 8 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and 9 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections," in the Secretary of the Commonwealth, further 11 providing for powers and duties of the Secretary of the 12 Commonwealth and for explanation of ballot question and 13 providing for wording of ballot question; in dates of 14 elections and primaries and special elections, further 15 providing for elections on proposed constitutional 16 amendments; in ballots, further providing for form of 17 official election ballot; in voting machines, further 18 providing for form of ballot labels on voting machines; and, 19 20 in preparation for and conduct of primaries and elections, further providing for publishing constitutional amendments. 21 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 23 hereby enacts as follows: 24 Section 1. Sections 201(c) and 201.1 of the act of June 3, 25 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election

1 Code, are amended to read:

2 Section 201. Powers and Duties of the Secretary of the 3 Commonwealth.--The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall exercise 4 in the manner provided by this act all powers granted to him by 5 this act, and shall perform all the duties imposed upon him by 6 this act, which shall include the following:

7 * * *

8 (c) To certify to county boards of elections for primaries and elections the names of the candidates for President and 9 10 Vice-President of the United States, presidential electors, United States senators, representatives in Congress and all 11 State offices, including senators, representatives, and judges 12 13 of all courts of record, and delegates and alternate delegates to National Conventions, and members of State committees, and 14 15 the form and wording of constitutional amendments, as prescribed 16 under section 201.2, or other questions to be submitted to the electors of the State at large. 17

Section 201.1. Explanation of Ballot Question. -- (a) 19 20 Whenever a proposed constitutional amendment or other State-wide ballot question shall be submitted to the electors of the 21 Commonwealth in referendum, the [Attorney General] Legislative 22 23 Reference Bureau shall prepare a statement in plain English which indicates the purpose, limitations and effects of the 24 25 ballot question on the people of the Commonwealth. The Legislative Reference Bureau shall publish the statement in the 26 Pennsylvania Bulletin and shall transmit the statement to the 27 28 Secretary of the Commonwealth. 29 (b) The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall include [such

30 statement in his] the statement under subsection (a) in the

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publication of a proposed constitutional amendment as required
 by Article XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

3 (c) The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall certify [such] 4 <u>the statement under subsection (a)</u> to the county boards of 5 elections who shall publish such statement as a part of the 6 notice of elections required by section 1201 or any other 7 provision of this act.

8 (d) The county board of elections shall also require that at 9 least three copies of [such] the statement under subsection (a) 10 be posted in or about the voting room outside the enclosed space 11 with the specimen ballots and other instructions and notices of 12 penalties.

13 (e) In election questions which affect only one county or 14 portion thereof, the county board of elections shall fulfill 15 these requirements in the place of the [Attorney General] 16 Legislative Reference Bureau and the Secretary of the

17 Commonwealth.

18 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

19 <u>Section 201.2.</u> Wording of Ballot Question.--Unless the

20 General Assembly shall prescribe otherwise, with respect to any

21 particular proposed amendment or amendments through the

22 <u>enactment of a statute, concurrent resolution or joint</u>

23 resolution, the Legislative Reference Bureau shall prescribe the

24 wording of the question to be posed to the electors and shall

25 publish the wording of the question in the Pennsylvania Bulletin

26 and transmit the wording of the question to the Secretary of the 27 Commonwealth.

28 Section 3. Sections 605, 1003(g), 1110(b) and 1201.2 of the 29 act are amended to read:

30 Section 605. Elections on Proposed Constitutional

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Amendments. -- Unless the General Assembly shall prescribe 1 2 otherwise with respect to any particular proposed amendment or 3 amendments and the manner and time of submitting to the qualified electors of the State any proposed amendment or 4 5 amendments to the Constitution for the purpose of ascertaining whether the same shall be approved by a majority of those voting 6 7 thereon, the said amendment or amendments which have heretofore, 8 or which may hereafter be proposed, and which have not been submitted to the qualified electors of the State, shall be 9 10 submitted to the qualified electors of the State for the purpose aforesaid, at the first municipal or general election at which 11 12 such amendment or amendments may be legally submitted to the 13 electors, which election shall occur at least three months after 14 the date upon which such proposed amendment or amendments shall 15 have been agreed to for the second time by a majority of the 16 members elected to each house of the General Assembly, as provided in Article Eighteen, section one of the Constitution. 17 18 Said election shall be conducted on said election day in the 19 manner prescribed by the provisions of this act. Such proposed 20 constitutional amendments shall be printed on the ballots or ballot labels in brief form to be determined by the Secretary of 21 the Commonwealth with the approval of the Attorney General. The 22 23 wording of the question shall be as prescribed under section_ 24 201.2.

25 Section 1003. Form of Official Election Ballot.-26 * * *

(g) The official ballots shall vary in form only as the names of districts, offices, candidates or the provisions of this act may require. When constitutional amendments or other questions are submitted to a vote of the electors, each

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amendment or other question so submitted may be printed upon the 1 2 ballot below the groups of candidates for the various offices, 3 and, when required by law, shall be so printed. Constitutional amendments so submitted shall be printed in brief form, to be 4 5 determined by the Secretary of the Commonwealth and as_ prescribed under section 201.2, and other questions so submitted 6 shall be printed in brief form, to be determined by the 7 8 Secretary of the Commonwealth in the case of questions to be voted on by the electors of the State at large and as prescribed 9 under section 201.2, and by the county boards in other cases. To 10 the right of each question there shall be placed the words "yes" 11 12 and "no," together with appropriate squares to the right of each 13 for the convenient insertion of a cross mark.

14 Section 1110. Form of Ballot Labels on Voting Machines.-15 * * *

16 (b) If the construction of the machine shall require it, the ballot label for each candidate, group of candidates, political 17 18 party, or question, to be voted on, shall bear the designating 19 letter or number of the counter on the voting machine which will 20 register or record votes therefor. Each question to be voted on shall appear on the ballot labels, in brief form, of not more 21 than seventy-five words, to be determined by the Secretary of 22 23 the Commonwealth in the case of constitutional amendments or 24 other questions to be voted on by the electors of the State at large and as prescribed under section 201.2, and by the county 25 26 election board in other cases.

28 Section 1201.2. Publishing Constitutional Amendments.--<u>(a)</u> 29 In accordance with the requirements of section 1 of Article XI 30 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, the Secretary of the

2	prescribed all proposed amendments to the Constitution of
3	Pennsylvania. <u>A publication under this subsection shall also</u>
